> meeting of experts is convened to clarify issues on air transport services to define the elements of the positive agenda of developing countries as regards both the GATS and specific sector negotiations of interest to them. It is suggested that the Meeting be organized in a manner that will permit the discussion to be supported by concrete examples from developing countries experiences. Accordingly, it is recommended that presentations by country experts, relevant international organizations and representatives of civil society (e.g. NGOs) include relevant developing country experiences relating to the issues being addressed.

- <u>Item 3 -</u> <u>Clarifying issues on air transport services to define the elements of</u> <u>the positive agenda of developing countries as regards both the GATS</u> <u>and the specific sector negotiations of interest to them</u>.
- 4. The Expert Meeting will have before it a background note prepared by the UNCTAD secretariat entitled "Air Transport Services: The positive agenda for developing countries" (TD/B/COM.1/EM.9/2). The discussions could follow the outline proposed in the background note: (I) major issues in the current air transport debate; (ii) problems facing developing countries in strengthening their export capacities and obtaining market access for air transport services; and (iii) action to address the problems, including in the context of the review of the GATS Annex on Air Transport Services.

Papers count cover country-specific experiences relating to: (a) problems and concerns in maintaining the efficiency and competitiveness of national airlines; (b) difficulties in penetrating the world markets for air transport services through the negotiations of bilateral agreements; © interests involved in the upcoming review of the GATS Annex on Air Transport Services and multilateral initiatives within the framework of ICAO. Country papers will be made available to other participants at the meeting in the form and language in which they are received.
