Item 1: Election of officers

1. It is recommended that the Expert Meeting elect a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson-cum-Rapporteur.

Item 3: Enhancing productive capacity of developing country firms through internationalization

3. At its ninth session, held in Geneva from 22 to 25 February 2005, the Commission on Enterprise, Business Facilitation and Development decided to convene an Expert Meeting on Enhancing Productive Capacity of Developing Country Firms through Internationalization.

4. As agreed by the Commission, this Expert Meeting will examine the conditions in which developing country firms, in particular SMEs, can successfully enhance their competitiveness through internationalization processes and whether this could lead to a new and mutually beneficial form of South-South cooperation. In addition, the Meeting will discuss what policy options can be used to strengthen enterprise competitiveness of developing countries through outward FDI.

5. The aim is to identify key policies and measures to be recommended to Governments, the private sector and the international community that could help strengthen competitiveness of developing country enterprises, particularly SMEs, through internationalization, including by means of outward FDI.

6. To facilitate the discussions, the UNCTAD secretariat has prepared an issues note entitled "Internationalization of developing country enterprises through outward foreign direct investment" and a series of country studies on the subject. In addition, experts are encouraged to prepare brief papers on the subject. These papers will be made available at the meeting in the form and language in which they are received. Panels will be organized to bring together three to four experts on each issue to launch the discussion. Issues include opportunities and challenges of internationalization for SMEs, internationalization of developing-country firms through outward FDI, outward FDI and enterprise competitiveness, policy issues and programmes supporting outward FDI from developing countries, and global players.
