#### Item 3. Pro-poor technology, innovation and entrepreneurship policies

3. For the concluding session of the Multi-year Expert Meeting, experts selected the topic "Leveraging innovation and technology for development: pro-poor entrepreneurship, innovation and technology – particularly for women and the next generation of leaders – and examination of the roles of business linkages and global value chains to support propoor measures". To facilitate the discussion, the UNCTAD secretariat has prepared an issues note entitled "Pro-poor technology, innovation and entrepreneurship policies". The issues note highlights the important role of technology and innovation policy and of entrepreneurship policies in spurring the development of people and communities living in poverty in developing countries. It raises awareness about the potential of innovation-driven development and the role of business linkages. In particular, this issue note covers creating pro-poor entrepreneurial opportunities by improving access to global value chains. It highlights the importance of developing capacities to identify and adapt technologies for local innovative uses, in order to alleviate poverty and improve the development opportunities in poor, and especially rural, communities.

4. While policies and practice from developed countries will provide some examples, the expert meeting will mainly focus on strategies and programmes for developing countries. The ultimate goal of the meeting is to present an overview of approaches to propoor entrepreneurship and technology and innovation that can assist policymakers in developing and implementing national policies addressing poverty alleviation. Experts will discuss practical and implementation-level challenges that development institutions face in developing countries with regard to their role as stakeholders in entrepreneurship and innovation-led development. In this respect, the expert meeting will benefit from the lessons learned from UNCTAD's technical assistance projects and research and analysis in these areas. In addition, experts are encouraged to prepare brief papers on the subject under discussion. These papers will be made available at the meeting in the form and language in which they are received.
