Item 3. Challenges and policy options for transport and trade facilitation

3. Over its four sessions, the multi-year expert meeting has addressed trade logistics issues in developing countries. The fourth and final session of the meeting will take the opportunity to recap on the outcomes of the preceding sessions and will look at challenges and policy options for the near future.

4. Transport- and trade facilitation-related policy options to improve developing countries' trade performance and competitiveness need to encompass – in a holistic approach – such relevant components as transport costs and access to efficient services, energy efficiency and sustainability of transport, the impacts of climate change on transport systems, and implementation of trade facilitation reforms and customs automation, as well as actions and policy options and the role that UNCTAD and partners can play in these fields.

5. Given the broad topic areas and in order to facilitate discussions, the UNCTAD secretariat has prepared a background note (TD/B/C.I/MEM.1/11) to assist participants in the deliberations at the session. In addition, experts are encouraged to prepare brief papers on the subject under discussion. These papers will be made available at the meeting in the form and language in which they are received.
