ANNOTATIONS

Item 1. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

1. Rule 7 of the rules of procedure requires that, at the beginning of each session, the Commission shall adopt the agenda for that session on the basis of the provisional agenda. The provisional agenda and documentation for the tenth session of the Commission on Science and Technology for Development were approved by the Economic and Social Council in its decision 2007/208 of 2 March 2007.

2. In accordance with established practice, the Commission, at its ninth session on 18 May 2006, elected by acclamation the Bureau for the tenth session, with the following composition:

3. As at previous sessions of the Commission, one of the Vice-Chairpersons will be designated to also serve as Rapporteur.

4. The proposed organization of work of the Commission at its tenth session (see annex I) has been prepared pursuant to relevant decisions of the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council to facilitate the consideration of agenda items within the timeframe available and in accordance with the conference services allocated to the Commission. The timetable should be considered tentative and indicative; if the Commission completes its consideration of an item ahead of schedule, it may wish to proceed immediately to the next item.

5. The Commission is scheduled to meet from Monday, 21 May, to Friday, 25 May 2007. The morning meetings will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and the afternoon meetings from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

6. The current membership of the Commission is contained in annex II for information.

Item 2. Substantive theme: "Promoting the building of a people-centred, developmentoriented and inclusive information society, with a view to enhancing digital opportunities for all people"

7. The World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS), organized by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) on behalf of the United Nations, took place in two phases – in 2003 in Geneva and 2005 in Tunis. In the Geneva Declaration of Principles, the first phase of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS)¹ adopted a common vision and commitment to building a people-centred, inclusive and development-oriented information society. The second phase of the Summit, at Tunis, endorsed the outcomes of the first phase and adopted a Commitment and an Agenda for the Information Society, which addressed *inter alia* the themes of financial mechanisms and Internet governance.

8. The Economic and Social Council was requested by the Tunis Agenda for the Information Society to oversee the UN system-wide follow-up of the outcomes of the Geneva and Tunis Phases of the Summit. To this end, ECOSOC was requested to review the mandate of the Commission on Science and Technology for Development (CSTD), including its strengthening, taking into account the multi-stakeholder approach.²

9. In its resolution 2006/46 of 28 July 2006, entitled "Follow-up to the World Summit on the Information Society and review of the Commission on Science and Technology for Development", the Council decided that the CSTD will effectively assist the Council as the focal point in the system-wide follow-up to the outcomes of the WSIS and advise the Council thereon, including through recommendations to the Council aimed at furthering the implementation of the Summit outcomes.

10. Against this background, and in anticipation of the Council resolution on the followup to the WSIS and review of its mandate during the Council substantive session in July 2006, at its ninth session the Commission on Science and Technology for Development decided to select "Promoting the building of a people-centred, development-oriented and inclusive information society with a view to enhancing digital opportunities for all people" as the substantive theme for its 2006-2008 work programme. The provisional agenda and documentation for its tenth session, which includes the main theme, was approved by Council decision 2007/208 of 2 March 2007.

11. In order to contribute to a further understanding of the issues, and to assist the CSTD in its deliberations at its tenth session, the UNCTAD secretariat, in collaboration with UNESCO, convened a panel meeting in Paris from 6 to 8 November 2006. The report from the Panel discussion will be before the Commission.³

12. The report of the Secretary-General⁴ aims to provide an overview of the progress made in the implementation of the outcomes of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) at the regional and international levels, highlighting examples of good and effective practices, with a view to sharing best and effective practices and lessons learned. It draws on the findings and recommendations of the Commission's panel discussion held in Paris in November 2006 on inputs by United Nations entities and specialized agencies and on other relevant literature.
