SUMMARY OF MEETINGS

Tuesday, 24 September 2013

1108th plenary meeting

Item 11 (b) Report on UNCTAD assistance to the Palestinian people

The Board began its consideration of the item with opening remarks by the President, H.E. Mr. Triyono Wibowo (Indonesia) and Mr. Petko Draganov, Deputy Secretary-General of UNCTAD. Mr. Mahmoud Elkhafif, Division on Globalization and Development Strategies, UNCTAD, introduced the secretariat's report on this item (TD/B/60/3).

During the general debate that followed, statements were made by the representatives of the following countries: Ecuador (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China), the Dominican Republic (on behalf of the Latin American and Caribbean Group), Iraq (on behalf of the Asian Group), the European Union, Ethiopia (on behalf of the African Group), Benin (on behalf of the least developed countries), the State of Palestine, Israel, China, South Africa, Thailand, Jordan, Egypt, the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, Indonesia, Kuwait, Algeria, Cuba, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Sudan, El Salvador and Saudi Arabia.

The Board took note of the report by the UNCTAD secretariat (TD/B/60/3) and the statements made by delegations and decided, in accordance with General Assembly decision 47/445, that the report of the Board on its sixtieth session to the General Assembly would include an account of the deliberations under this item.

- Item 12 Matters requiring action by the Board in the follow-up to the thirteenth session of the Conference
 - (a) Follow-up to the Joint Inspection Unit report and the agreed conclusions of the twenty-sixth special session of the Trade and Development Board on 6 July 2012

The President of the Board made opening remarks on the agenda item. Mr. Petko Draganov, Deputy Secretary-General of UNCTAD, presented the progress report on the implementation of the workplan for enhancing the management and administration of UNCTAD (TD/B/60/5) and an update on the implementation of the work programme. Ms. Ester Busser, Assistant Director of the International Trade Union Confederation, presented the report on the fourth UNCTAD Public Symposium: New economic approaches for a coherent post-2015 agenda (TD/B/60/6).

Statements were made by the representatives of the following countries: Ecuador (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China), South Africa and the Dominican Republic.
