Total income 2008–2011 is defined as contributions received within that period. In the case of projects financed by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), total incomes equal total expenditures.

Allotment is defined as funding of budget for the year.

 (As a percentage of total project expenditures)

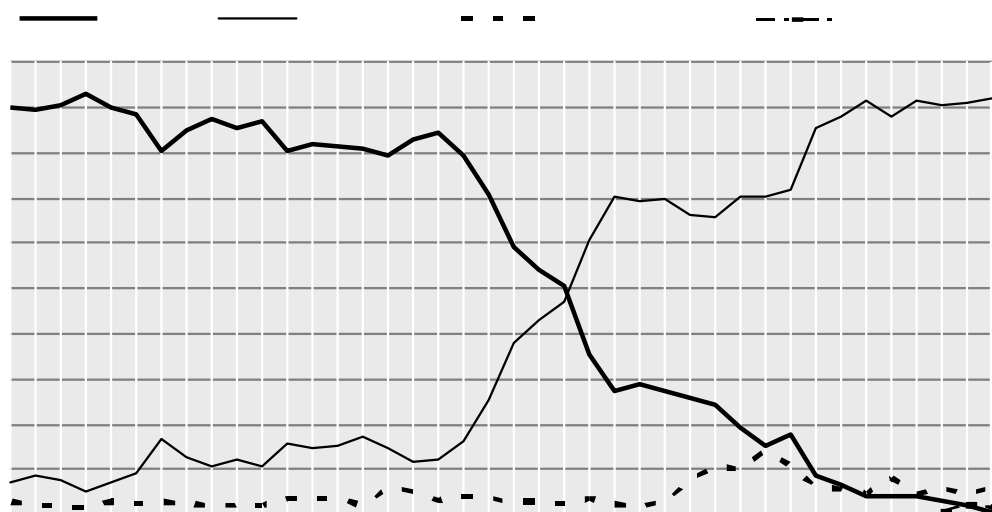
