Comments on Presentation

Study has provided a good analysis of the potential, current status and prospects for the development of cotton byproducts in Zambia achieving the key study objectives to:

- Identifying impediments and opportunities.
- Understanding the infrastructure and technology at each level.
- Understanding producers demographic and income profiles.
- Understanding the motivations of chain players to invest.
- Identifying incentives for the various players to invest.

Impediments and Opportunities

- A brief analysis of the policy framework and environment. Policy makers are key stakeholders.
- Low production of seed cotton is the most important impediment affecting the whole sector. A more detailed analysis is deserving. Major causes of low production.
- 1. Low farm yields
- Agronomic-Timeliness of field operations
- Poor soils (inherent or due to prolonged cultivation) low organic matter, soil ph, etc.
- Low inputs, (fertilisers, pesticides)
- Low mechanisation to substitute the high labour costs
- Low technology adoption

Impediments and opportunities contd...

- 2. Economic factors (may even be more impotant than agronomic)
- This is mainly price
- 3. Outgrower organisation and service delivery effectiveness
- Extension and input support
- Sector coordination

Textiles and clothing Industry

- The textiles and clothing industries are important players in cotton value chain.
- Zambia had before 2006 a robust and notable textile industry employing over 10,000 workers.
- These industries have undergone a sharp decline due mainly to:
- Reduced domestic demand and foreign competitiveness
- Decapitalisation and outdated production technology
- Lack of capital and investment financing
- Inadequate protection

Recommendations

 Should be specific and should address the impediments and weaknesses raised in the value chain analysis such as low production and farmer productivity.
