#### **Stock sustainability:** Selective species, protection of juvenile, breeding areas

Pole and line fishing Limited fishing effort No discards Protected areas Good reporting

### **Environment and eco-friendly**

Net fishing prohibited No trawling (bottom or otherwise) Blast and poison prohibited Turtles/sharks protected (2011) Coral mining restrictions

### **Community engagement**

### **Fisher friendly**

Short period at sea (normally return same day)

Immediate and often in kind payment Safe vessels (built, operated and maintained under regulations) EEZ fishing only beyond 100 miles from coast and for local entities No distant water fishery
