**Peer Review of Competition Law and Policy: Mongolia<sup>1</sup>**

Mongolia has implemented considerable reforms in its competition law regime in the past decade. The purpose of the peer review is to assess the legal framework and enforcement experience in Mongolia and to draw lessons from past experiences with a view to improving competition law enforcement in the country. In this context, the Mongolian Competition Agency volunteered to participate in a Peer Review of Competition Law and Policy organised by UNCTAD.

With substantial support provided by the Authority for Fair Competition and Consumer Protection (AFCCP) of Mongolia, the competition expert, Vladimir Kachalin, State Advisor of the Russian Federation and Assistant/Advisor to the Head of Federal Antimonopoly Service of Russia, assessed the state of competition law and policy in Mongolia and prepared the Peer Review Report.

This report will serve as a basis for the peer review examination during the 12<sup>th</sup> session of the IGE. The examination panel will include representatives of other competition authorities. In addition, speakers from the floor will be invited to contribute to the discussions. The peer review will be interactive and will provide the Mongolian competition authority with a unique opportunity to draw lessons from the experiences of other competition authorities in the implementation of competition law and policy.

The findings and policy recommendations of the peer review will be used to design tailor-made technical assistance activities to reinforce the effectiveness of competition law enforcement in Mongolia. Development agencies, technical assistance providers, bilateral donors and international organizations are invited to support the respective technical assistance activities.
