# **Round Table on:** The protection of vulnerable and disadvantaged consumers

Monday 3 July 2017 (15:00 – 16:30) Palais des Nations, Room XVII (First Floor)

In 2015, the revised United Nations Guidelines for Consumer Protection of 2015<sup>1</sup> recognized for the first time the protection of vulnerable and disadvantaged consumers as one of the legitimate needs which the guidelines are intended to meet.

According to recent research, 2 consumer vulnerability should be considered in light of various dimensions, such as socio-demographic, behavioural, personal (situation) and market environment.3

To facilitate this interactive discussion, the UNCTAD secretariat raises the following issues:

- (a) What initiatives do member States develop to address the needs of vulnerable and disadvantaged consumers?
- (b) What strategies can member States develop in the field of financial services for vulnerable and disadvantaged consumers, involving businesses and civil society?
- Considering consumer vulnerabilities in a changing world, how can international cooperation contribute to a more inclusive and sustainable environment for vulnerable and disadvantaged consumers?
