Commission on Science and Technology for Development

Geneva, 7–8 November 2019

The Secretary-General of UNCTAD presents his compliments to, and has the honour to inform, Governments and the organizations concerned that the Commission on Science and Technology for Development will hold its 2019–2020 intersessional panel meeting in Geneva, from 7 to 8 November 2019.

The following two priority themes will be addressed:

- Theme 1: Harnessing rapid technological change for inclusive and sustainable development
- Theme 2: Exploring space technologies for sustainable development and the benefits of international research collaboration in this context.

In addition, the panel will examine issues related to the follow-up to the outcomes of the World Summit on the Information Society. Findings and recommendations of the panel are expected to be considered at the twenty-third session of the Commission, to be held in March 2020.

UNCTAD will defray the travel and per diem costs of invited representatives of States members of the Commission. Representatives of States not members of the Commission are welcome to participate, based on the understanding that the cost of their attendance will be borne by their respective Governments. The membership of the Commission, as of 7 May 2019, is attached for reference.
