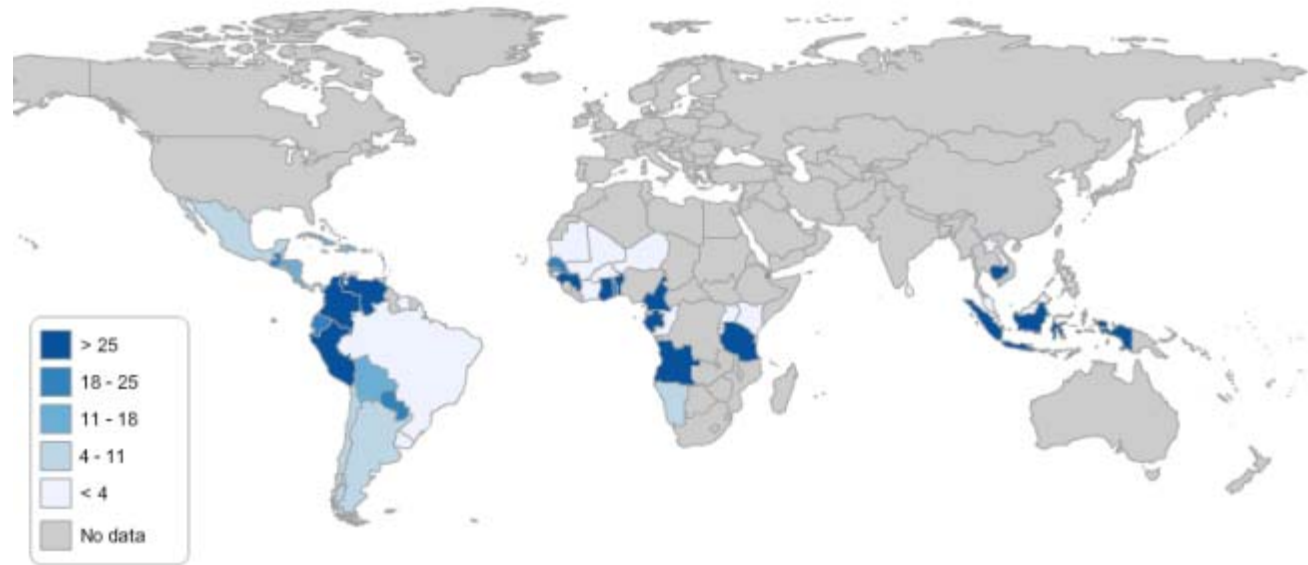


HRDS/TFT at a glance

TFT Outputs in 2011

- 14 courses
- 911 trade operators, including 285 women
- 37 developing countries, 10 LDCs
- 4 train-the-trainers courses for 94 trade operators
- 264 trainees were trained by local trainers

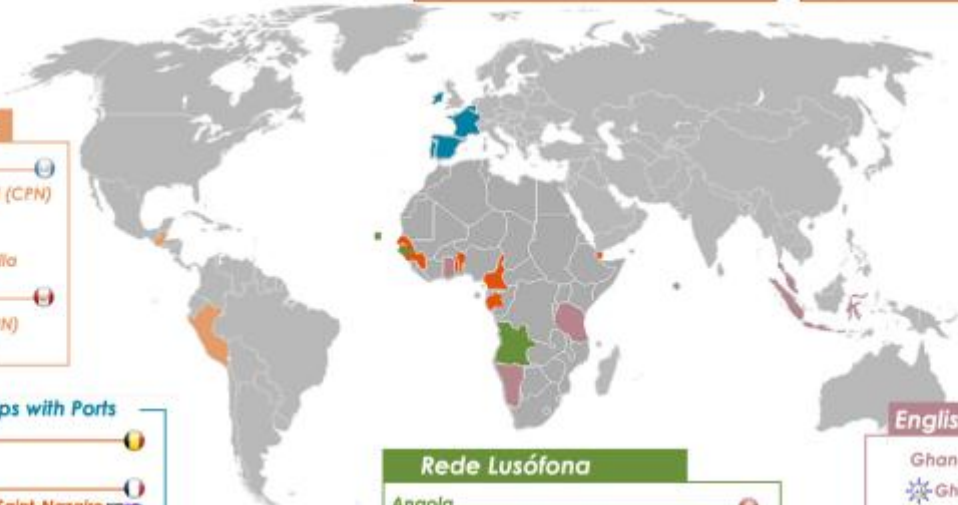

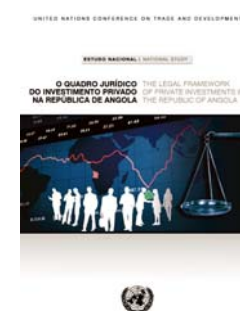

UNCTAD Paragraph 166 Regional Course on Key Issues on the International Economic Agenda

This is UNCTAD's flagship course on trade and development

- It provides policy makers with a focus on the links between trade, investment, finance, technology and development and aims to enhance their understanding of the relationship among these areas and their link to countries' development strategies.
- They are equipped with knowledge and skills for the design and implementation of relevant trade and development policies
- It takes a cross-divisional and cross-regional approach in the design of the curricula.
- The curricula is based on UNCTAD's research and policy analysis in the areas of trade, finance, investment, technology.



UNCTAD Paragraph 166 Regional Course on Key Issues on the International Economic Agenda

- It derived its mandate from the Bangkok Plan of Action.
- And has been renewed at every UNCTAD conference at Sao Paulo, Accra and Doha.
- It has trained over 550 trade policy officials and academics who now form a network from the five developing regions since 2001.

UNCTAD Paragraph 166 Regional Course on Key Issues on the International Economic Agenda

- The course is now supported by Governments in the developing regions who provide national experts and logistics and other support.
- Multi-year venues are now fully available in Oman (for Western Asia) and in Mauritius (for Africa).
- Efforts are underway to seek other multi-year venues for Asia-Pacific, countries with economies in transition and Latin America-Caribbean regions.
