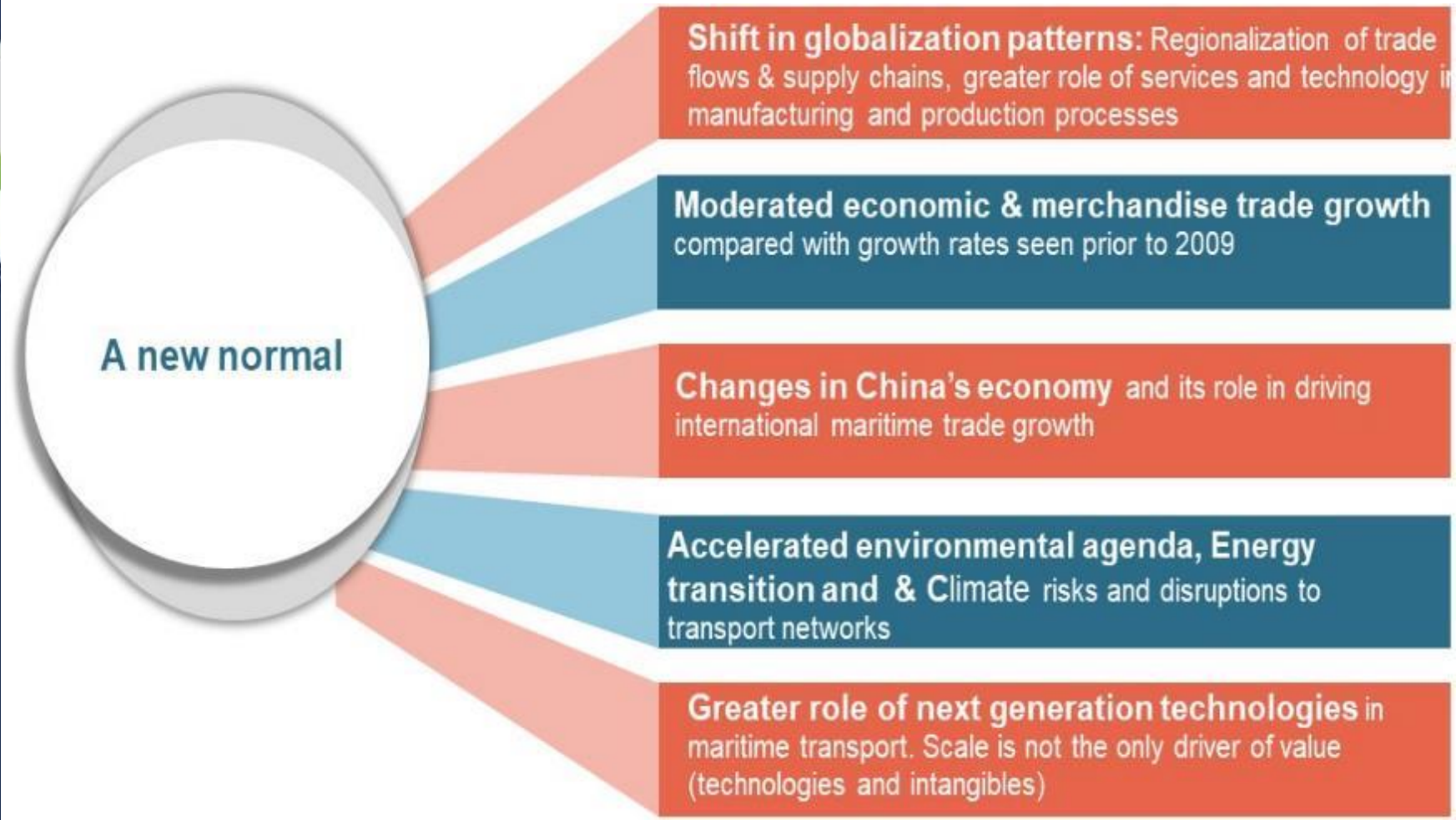

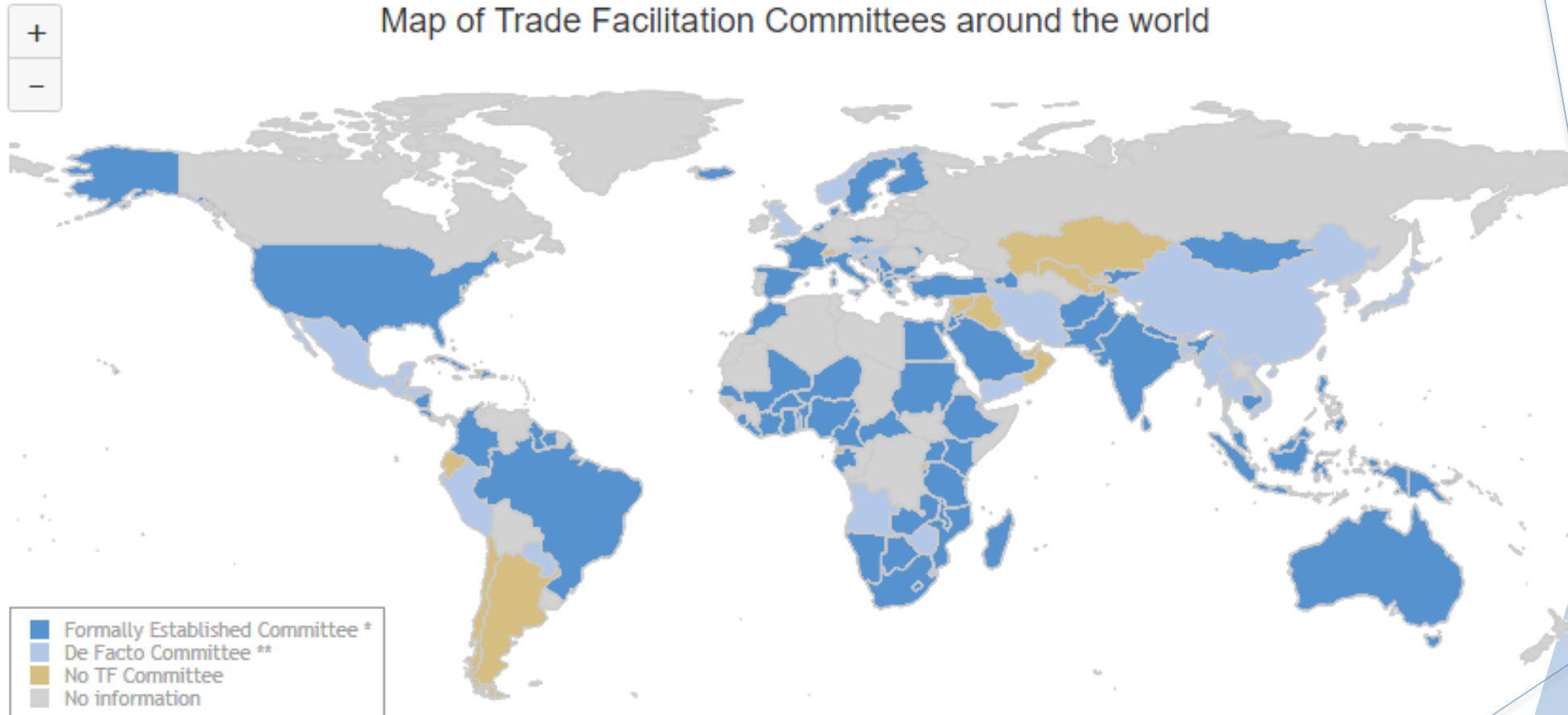

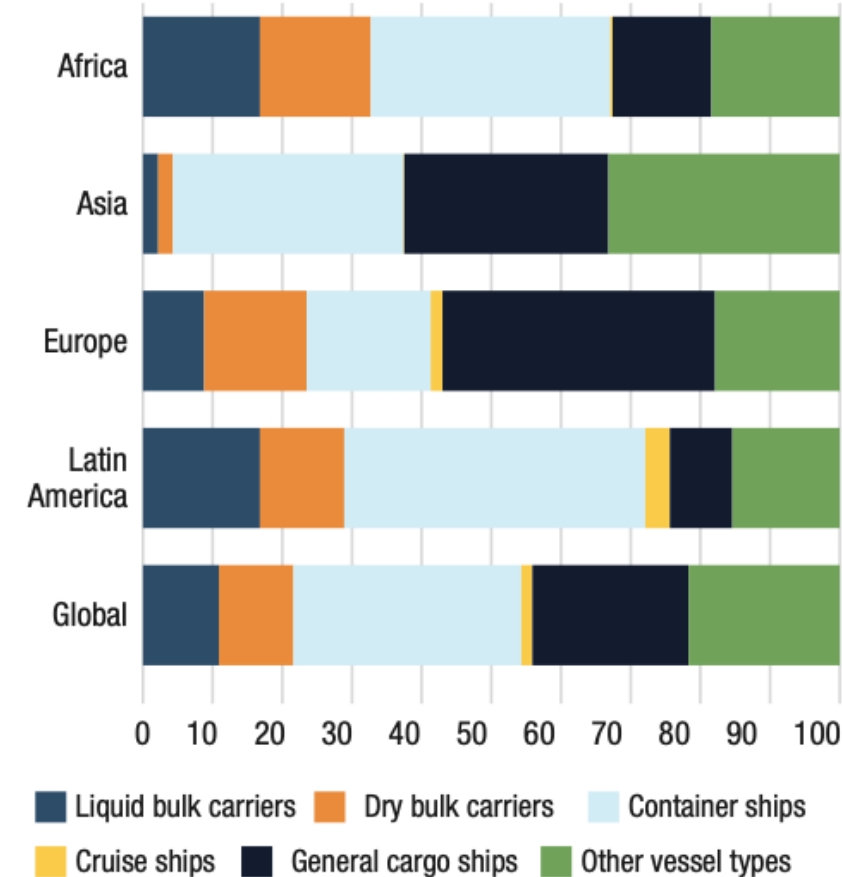

## OUTPUTS and RESULTS (last 5 years):

- ▶ Active in over 100 countries
- ▶ 100 workshops delivered every year
- ▶ Over 5000 professionals trained (~30% women)
- ▶ Synergies with UNCTAD research through database on port performance, collection of research by graduates in Port Management Series, used in RMT.

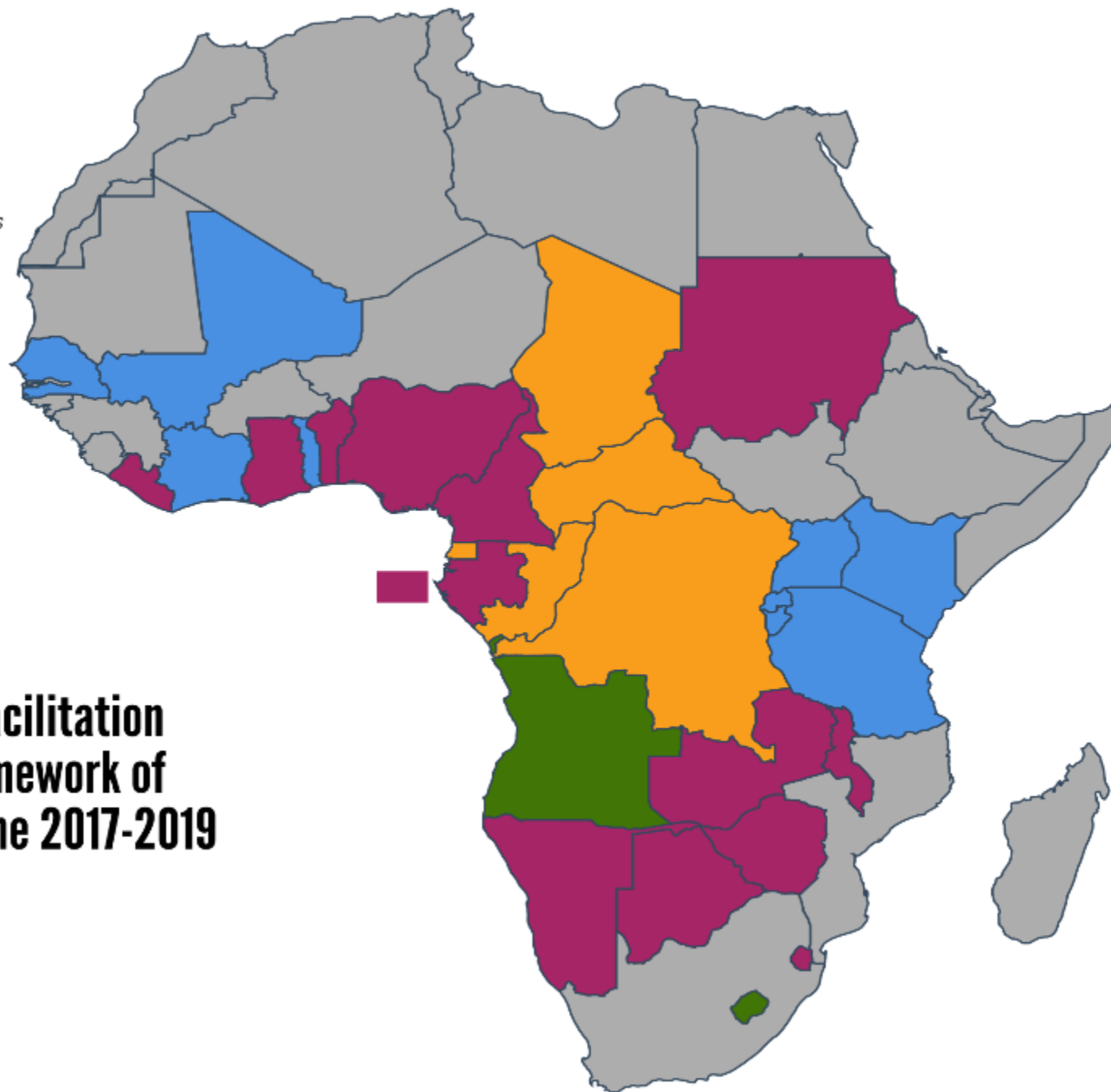

# Trade Logistics at the core of e-commerce

- ▶ Legal review work on the establishment of the Electronic Single Window in Jamaica
- ▶ ECommerce week 2019 : sessions on ecommerce logistics, and de-minimis regimes in e-commerce

- ▶ 6 PACER Plus Pacific countries opted for ASYCUDA
- ▶ COMESA-UNCTAD agreement to develop Customs Automation Regional Support Centre
- ▶ ECOWAS-ASYCUDA Regional Transit Module in 3 West-African corridors

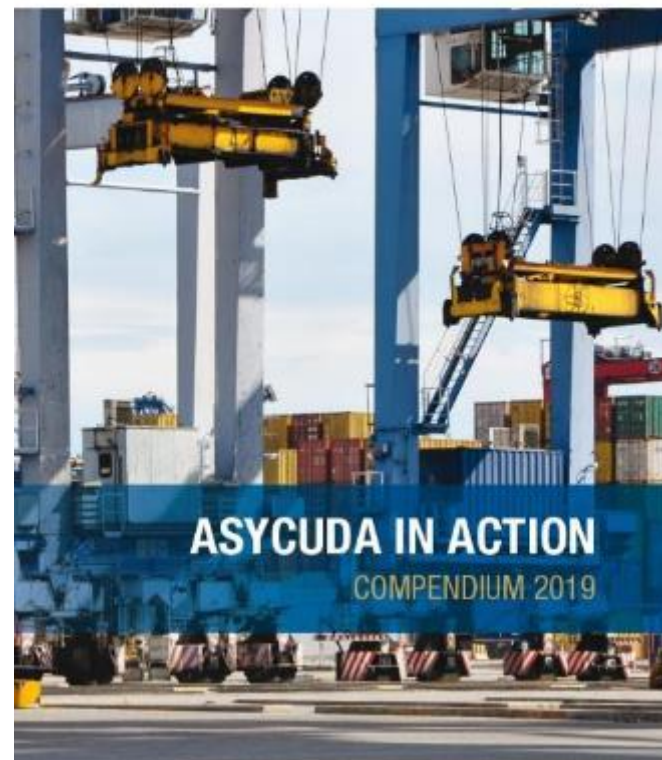


# ASYCUDA IMPACTS

- ▶ **Angola (2018):** 43% increase in revenue after ASYCUDAWorld launched in 2017
- ▶ **Jamaica (2019):** 70% of commercial cargo released within 6 hours after payment
- ▶ **Uganda (2018):** Single Window reduced trade cost by 70% and export time from 14 to 2 days
- ▶ **Vanuatu (2019):** ASYCUDA Passenger Processing Module created to compile and analyze traveler data in a timely manner

*“Comparing to last year [2017], imports have increased by 14% and exports have grown by 30%. This is all due to the introduction of the ASTANA-1 system based on ASYCUDAWorld”*

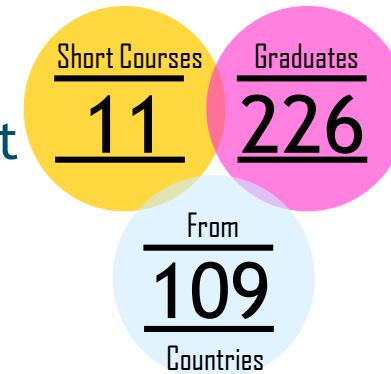

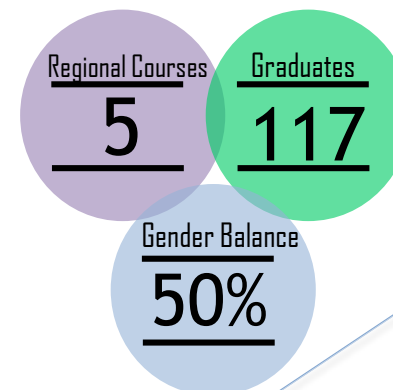

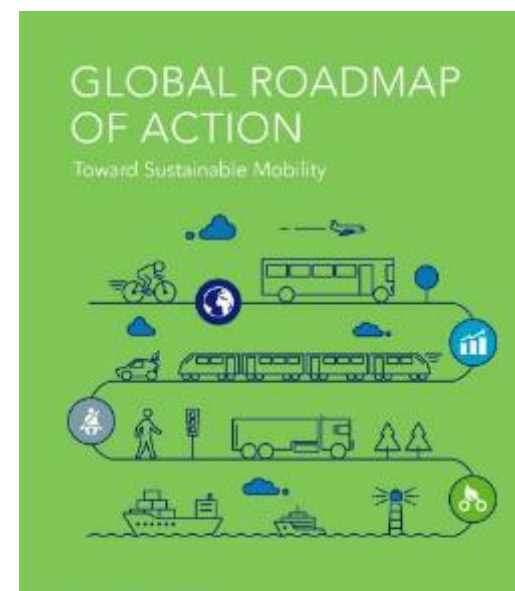

### The Challenge

Shipping made a breakthrough in 2018 when the International Maritime Organization (IMO) adopted a strategy to decarbonize the sector. The IMO initial strategy aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and the latest Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) decarbonization by 2050. While the industry is exploring decarbonization by alternative fuels and engines, but a significant barrier is the availability of zero-emission fuels. The industry is also facing a key risk to decarbonization: the lack of infrastructure for alternative fuels.

### The Opportunity

Whether the industry is to achieve 50% or a more ambitious 100% decarbonization by 2050, the first steps are the same: there is a need to push innovation and research from the drawing board into the water to enable



# Partnerships & consensus building in Trade Facilitation



- ▶ **Ministerial Declaration on Trade Facilitation in the East African Community**, to advance the trade facilitation agenda in the EAC countries and the regional Protocols through a strong political commitment
- ▶ Implemented in partnership with TradeMark East Africa
- ▶ WTO TFA collaboration



# TrainForTrade Programme (TFT): international dialogue and partnerships

TFT Advisory Group and TFT Coordination meetings (French, English and Spanish-speaking networks)

- ▶ identify capacity building priorities and emerging issues
- ▶ plan and review project implementation
- ▶ facilitate S-S exchange of experience and sharing best practices identified by projects

TFT relies on multiple partnerships and South-South cooperation

- ▶ Port Management Programme co-funded by donors (Ireland, Port of Gijon, Marseille, Nantes, Valencia, Irish ports) and beneficiaries themselves.
- ▶ Ownership: Over the past decade 60% of TFT-PMP was funded by developing countries ports (including 23% from LDCS)
