




ITC's contribution to Output 1.2 "A BioTrade knowledge sharing mechanism is established" aims at:






ABS Initiative Intervention Logic



<u>Strategic objective:</u> Facilitated market linkages for companies selling BioTrade-related products

Target:

20% increase in bussiness applying Ethical BioTrade practices and/or UNCTAD BioTrade P&C (baseline: 130 companies)

Output 3.1: Increase market demand
