Cabinet as part of National Trade Committee (NTC).

Degree of institutionalisation: Cabinet decision

Type of organisation (ad hoc group, legal entity/organisation, etc): Legal

Coordinating agency: Ministry of Trade

Scope/mandate: The National working group shall function as the coordinating and consultative body. To advise on domestic, regional and international policy matters related to TF. The National Committee has taken actions to facilitate cross-border e-commerce, such as the Adaptation of the Regional CARICOM Strategy on Trade Facilitation, CARICOM Members States - Tariff data.

Terms of reference: Yes

Working structure of the group: Chair/co-chair and sub-groups

Permanent technical secretariat: No. It is because of lacking of financial resources.

Funding:

Budget: No formal budget however if expenses arise these will be borne by the Government of Antigua and Barbuda from funds that have been allocated to the Ministry's Annual Budget. There is no budget for the NTFC because of lacking of domestic resources. Budget will be needed for the reproduction and publications services, meeting venues and catering, and training sessions.

Sources of funding: Ministry of Trade Annual Budget

Items covered by the budget: Stationary, Venue Rental (Subsidised as in most cases theses are Government Properties)

Objectives / Focus:

Objectives: To make recommendations on strategic trade facilitation goals and operational solution.

To provide a forum for stakeholder consultation and increase awareness of trade facilitation measure, develop operational procedures.

Working plan: Yes. The time frame for it is twice per year.

Monitoring and evaluation: To the extent of 70% that the National Trade Facilitation Committee fulfills its role of monitoring and evaluating the implementation of the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement. Monitoring tools include monitoring plan with indicators and consultations with stakeholders. There is no specific evaluation tool. Familiar with the following tools: UN Global Survey on Trade Facilitation and Paperless Trade Implementation, World Bank Doing Business Trading Across Borders.

Reporting form and supervisory authority: Ad hoc. Not formalised.

Benefits:

Impact: Utilization of Asycuda world, New Customs Management Act 2013.

Benefits for the country's responsiveness to the WTO negotiation process: Increase awareness of the benefits of operationalization of the Trade Facilitation Agreement to the business community.

Concrete operational outcomes: Improve the ease of doing business for the commercial sector.Negotiation of trade or trade facilitation agreements;Implementation of concrete trade facilitation measures;Developed an implementation plan for the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement;Improved coordination;Ratification / notifications of the Trade Facilitation Agreement sent to the WTO;Improve business environment for traders;Reduction of time and / or improvement of procedures at the border;Raise awareness on the importance of trade facilitation.

Lessons learned:

Success factors: It is thought, to the extent of 90%, that the Committee will be sustainable in time. The crucial factors to the sustainability of the Committee are: Cooperation among members / Common understanding and goals, Clear responsibility of participants, Commitment from members, Political commitment / high level support, Close monitoring of results.

Greatest obstacles: Lack of technical and financial support, Inadequate infrastructure, Limited and lack of trained human resource, Lack of awareness of importance of NTFC / understanding of trade facilitation, Lack of regularity of meetings.

Lessons learned from your experience:

Need for deeper collaboration and co-ordination among border agencies. e.g MOU'S. Limited knowledge of TFA by some stakeholders.

Future plans:

Plans for further development: Formalized committee. Established dates for regular meetings. Also, the regional integration has been considered a lot within the work of the NTFC, and it is in contact with other National Trade Facilitation Committees in the region.
