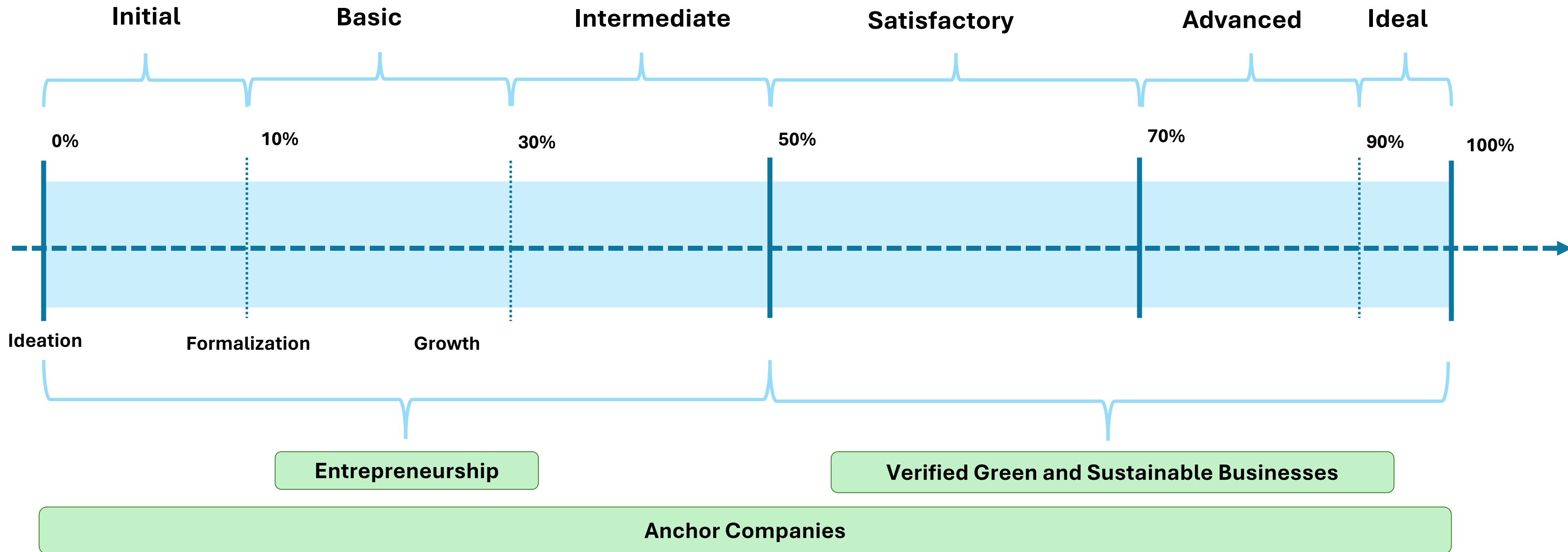

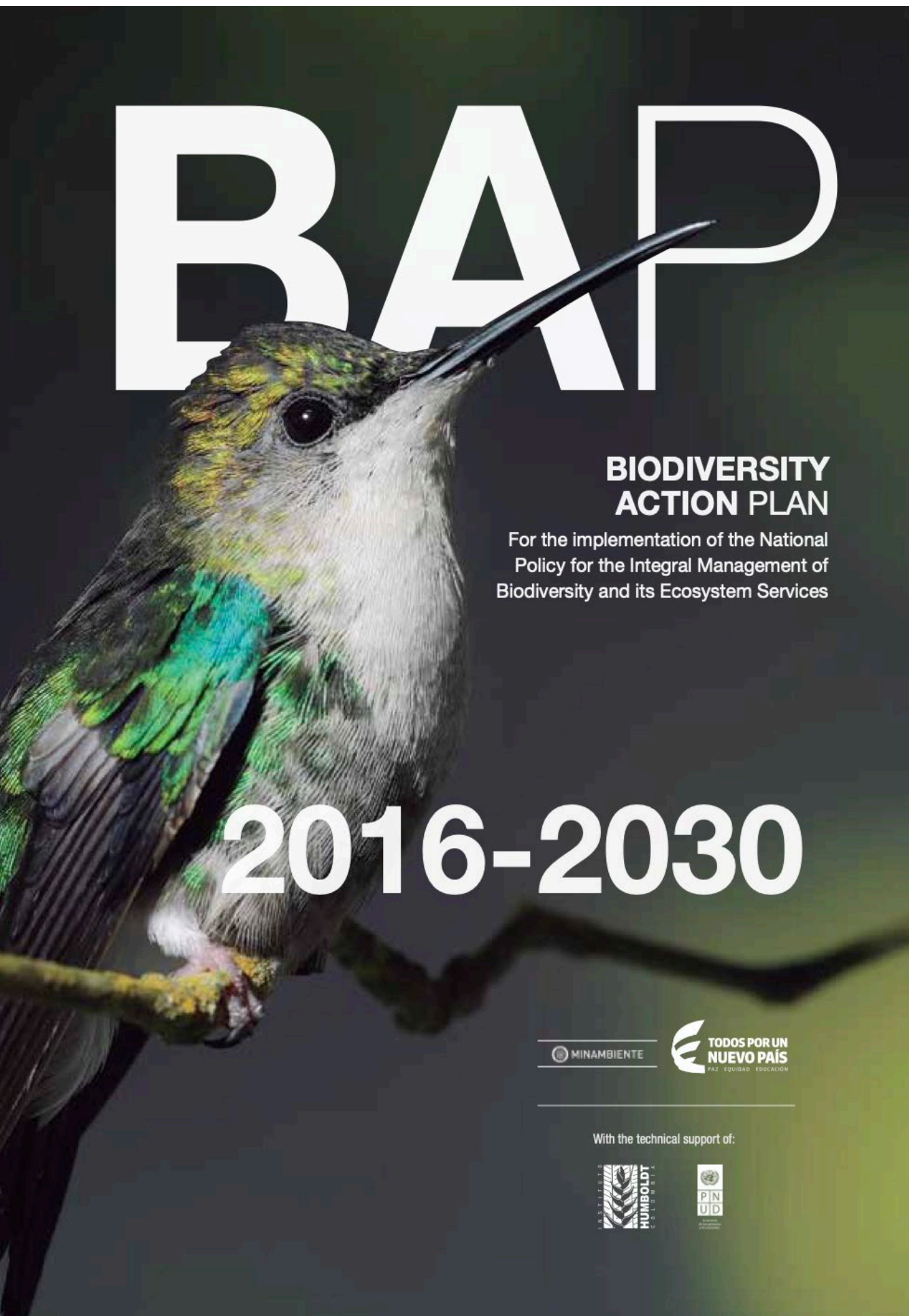

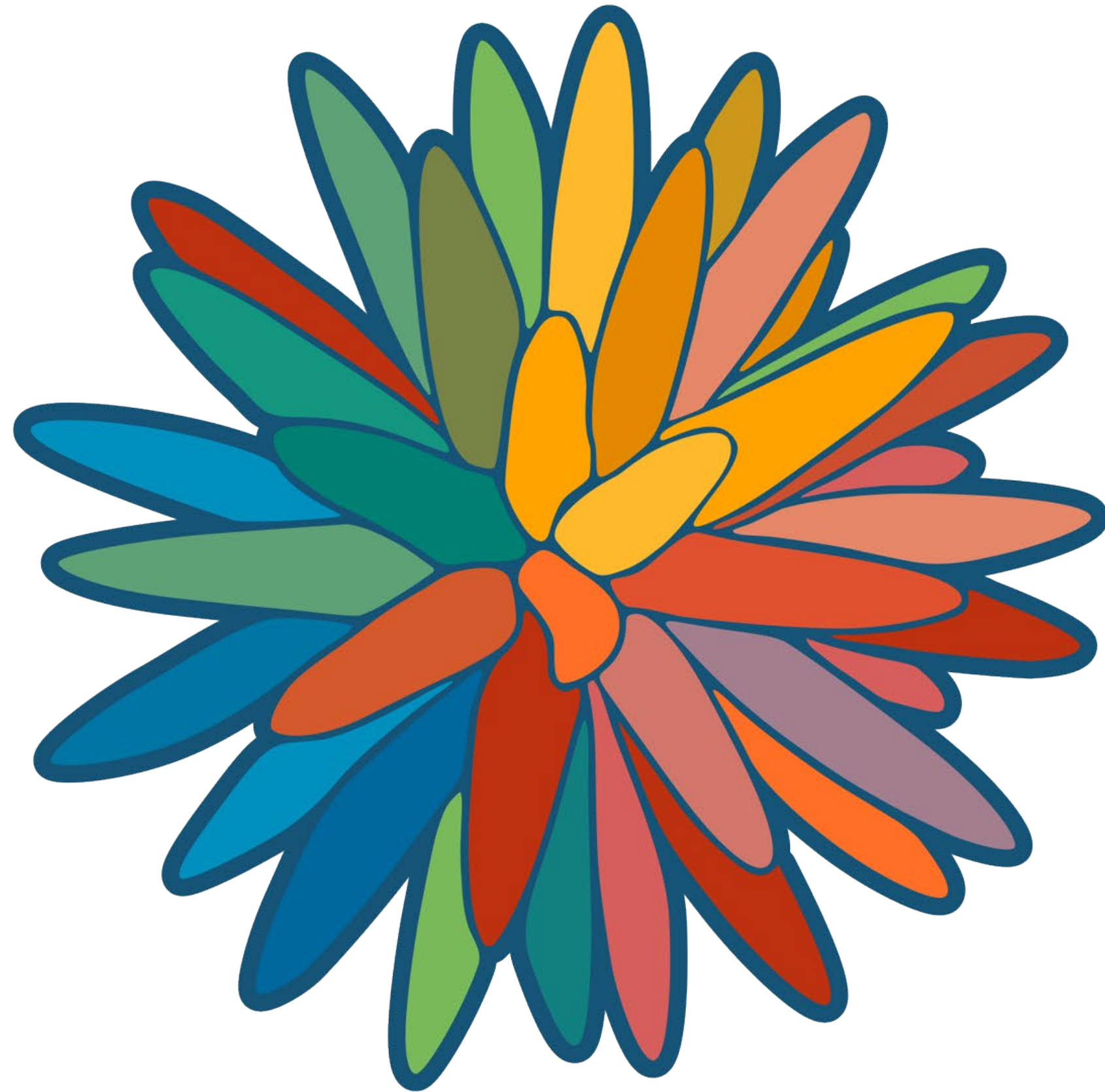
Target 15

All companies (public or private, large, medium or small) assess and report on their dependencies and impacts on biodiversity, both locally and globally, and progressively **reduce negative impacts by at least half and increase positive impacts, reducing risks in relation to biodiversity** and move towards full sustainability of extraction and production practices, supply chains, sourcing, supply, use and disposal.
