Streamline Regulatory processes and invest in Digital T.F. tools

Invest in Trade Facilitation via Digitalization

- reduce/eliminate paper usage
- reduce/eliminate physical trips to authorities
- monitoring trade including its impact on climate change
- reduce wastage (return of goods)

IMPLEMENTATION

Regional level - climate smart Trade facilitation
National level - UNCTAD is working on the calculator to make public soon

Improving Traceability & Transparency via Digital Innovation

FAO - reduction of pests, better practices for water management, soil
FAO + Brazil
① 80% producers come from family farmer
- limited access to training, technical assistance, info on markets, financial services
- not mechanized for production
- small production areas, high production costs
- lack of traceability and connectivity

Cotton industry is very important to the value chain and is expected to have continued growth

Green Transition and sustainability should be on the TF radar

Trade Policy Tools for Climate Change Action

KEY CHALLENGES T.F. Environmental aspects

- Carbon emissions**
paper - production, transportation, deforestation
- waste** - accumulation of parts, improper disposal
- illegal trading** - protected species, prohibited commodities

NTFC's can check to see if the plans address these

SOLUTIONS

- digitalization (address fragmentation)
- virtual line management system
- appointment booking system for border
- other measures to improve efficiency
- system at the borders
- to reduce emissions etc.
- multi-lateral environment agreements - using necessary protocols and management

ASSESSMENTS

- Product Life Cycle Analysis
- Inclusive Chains: Family Farming Cooperatives
- Accompanying chain actors on the road to sustainability: Agriculture + Textiles + Digital tools
- Stakeholders commitment to integrate and make transparent practices along supply chain
- Digital Literacy of Farmers
- Digitalized management and records of agricultural practices on the field.
