Peer Review of Competition Law and Policy: Botswana

Botswana is in the process of reforming it competition regime after its six years of experience in competition law enforcement. The purpose of this peer review is to assess the legal framework and enforcement experience in Botswana and to draw lessons from past experiences with a view to improving competition law enforcement in the country. In this context, the Competition Authority of Botswana (CAB) volunteered to participate in a Peer Review of Competition Law and Policy organized by UNCTAD.

With substantial support provided by the Competition Authority of Botswana (CAB), the competition expert, Dr. Allan Mulula and Mrs Elizabeth Gachuiri, UNCTAD, examined the status of competition law and policy in Botswana and prepared the peer review report including recommendations.<sup>1</sup>

This report will serve as a basis for the peer review examination during the 17<sup>th</sup> session of the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Competition Law and Policy (IGE). The review panel will include representatives of the competition authorities of Kenya, South Africa and a Competition Expert from United States. In addition, speakers from the floor will have an opportunity to contribute to the discussion. The peer review will be interactive and provide Botswana competition authority with a unique opportunity to draw lessons from the experiences of other competition authorities in competition law enforcement.

UNCTAD used the findings and policy recommendations of the peer review report in designing a tailor-made technical assistance project to reinforce the effectiveness of competition law enforcement in Botswana. UNCTAD would like to invite development partners and donors to support this project, which will be presented during the session.
