#### I. Overview

The Regional Seminar on Facilitating Investment in Sustainable Development Goal Projects: Spotlight on Small Island Developing States took place in St. Kitts and Nevis from 26 to 28 November 2019. The event was organized in partnership with the Caribbean Association of Investment Promotion Agencies (CAIPA) and the Caribbean Export Development Agency (CEDA). The seminar, which was hosted by the St. Kitts Investment Promotion Agency (SKIPA), focused on investment facilitation, investment in Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) projects and sectors of importance to Small Island Developing States (SIDS), including agrobusiness, infrastructure and the blue economy.

The event was opened by Hon. Mr. Shawn Richards, Deputy Prime Minister of St. Kitts and Nevis. Ms. Tessa Jacques, President of CAIPA, Ms. Jasemin Weekes, Caribbean Export Board Member, Mr. Stanley Jacobs, Director of Investment Promotion of SKIPA and Mr. Paul Wessendorp, Chief of UNCTAD's Investment Promotion Programme. In his address, Hon. Mr. Richards stated that SIDS face a number of economic challenges that undermine their ability to achieve the SDGs and that Caribbean SIDS therefore should focus their attention on attracting investments that do not increase their vulnerabilities. "This is why, this seminar is so meaningful and welcome to help Caribbean SIDS to identify areas of potential action attracting economic activity, jobs, and investment opportunities."

The seminar sessions started with an UNCTAD overview of global and regional foreign direct investment trends, including in SIDS, and a presentation by UN OHRLLS on the status of the Small Island Developing States Accelerated Modalities of Action or the SAMOA pathway.

The 3-day programme covered an array of subjects related to the facilitation of foreign investment in SDG projects, including presentations and discussions (of which five by video conference) on online business registration platforms, special economic zones (SEZs), Citizenship by Investment Programmes (CIP) and the impact of investment in key SDG sectors in the region. Presentations were also given on regional initiatives and partner arrangements with the Caribbean Climate Smart Accelerator, the Caribbean Agribusiness Association and the UN Women/EU Win-Win Programme in Jamaica on gender equality in business. The seminar also included a site visit to an ecotourism real-estate development project financed through the St. Kitts' CIP.

The last day of the seminar was dedicated to discussions on the global reform of the international investment agreement (IIA) regime, latest developments with IIAs in CARICOM, and the relevance of these trends for investment facilitation. During CAIPA's General Assembly, discussions were held on future cooperation between the association and UNCTAD.

Some of the most important takeaways from the seminar include:

- ▶ SIDS face unique challenges and opportunities in attracting FDI, particularly in SDG related sectors such as climate change mitigation and adaptation, food and agriculture as well as infrastructure.
- ▶ Regional cooperation and the exchange of best practices is the way forward to attract and benefit from investment in the Caribbean, including through joint investment promotion initiatives, like the online UNCTAD investment guides.
- ▶ Investment promotion agencies have a key role to play in identifying innovative partnerships to facilitate investment towards the SDGs.

- ▶ Investment facilitation tools, such as SEZs, can be catalysts for enhancing the impact of FDI including investment in SDG projects.
- Efficient investment facilitation, including efforts to reform IIAs, is key to attract quality FDI towards SDG sector.

During the 3-day event, 50 investment promotion officials and representatives of international organizations, regional initiatives and the private sector shared tools, best practices and experiences. From the participants in the seminar, including resource persons, 31 were women.

Feedback received indicates that participants found the seminar informative, insightful, useful and an excellent networking experience.

78% of 27 surveyed participants rated the seminar as "good" or "excellent" and beneficial for their work. 22 % rated it "satisfactory/adequate". Participants also indicated that they will share takeaways with colleagues.




