Review of UNCTAD Model Law on Competition, Part 2: Commentaries

UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD)'s Model Law on Competition (Model Law) serves as an important reference and benchmark in voluntary peer reviews and reviews of countries' competition laws. The Model Law is composed of two parts: Part 1 prescribes substantive possible elements to be included in competition laws and remains unchanged, whereas Part 2 is revised regularly, chapter by chapter, based on inputs and contributions from member States and academia. The commentaries to the Model Law, comprising part 2, compile practices from various jurisdictions around the world, including the most experienced and relatively young ones. They are revised regularly by the UNCTAD secretariat based on contributions from member States.

This session will be devoted to presenting recent developments aimed at improving access to and dissemination of the Model Law, as well as ongoing efforts to ensure its systematic review and updating.
