1. Participation and registration

We recommend participants to use their personal e-mail addresses for registration, as links to the actual meeting will be communicated via e-mail.

2. Arrangement for the conduct of discussion

A. Verbal statements

Delegations that would like to make an intervention during any of the hybrid sessions are strongly encouraged to inform the CSTD Secretariat not later than 20 March 2023. To facilitate interpretation, delegates are kindly requested to submit one day in advance a copy of their written interventions/remarks by email to <u>stdev@unctad.org</u>.

We would like to request delegations to the extent possible to make one statement only per country or organization per session, and to participate in the discussions through one delegate who will take the floor.

On the online platform, delegates can request the floor by using the "hand raising" functionality. Delegates are asked to observe the time limit of 3 minutes for interventions during the sessions. Please note that interpretation services for interventions by remote participants is limited to a cumulative total of 30 minutes per session. Thus, after participant interventions made remotely exceed 30 minutes, interpretation will be subsequently provided only for in-person interventions.

D. Physical participation

The <u>CSTD 26th session</u> is scheduled to commence at 10:30 a.m. on 27 March 2023. It will be held at the <u>Tempus Room</u> in the Palais des Nations.

Wearing a mask in the Palais des Nations is no longer required, though participants and staff are free to wear one if they wish, while continuing to keep safe distances.

Before entering the Palais des Nations through the <u>Peace Gate "bis</u>", participants are requested to collect their badges at the <u>Villa Les Feuillantines</u>, Avenue de la Paix 13, 1211 Geneva 10. You have to come well in advance and make sure you bring your valid UN Member State National Passport or ID card from a Schengen State. The Security Service is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. on weekdays. Because of the security measures in force, participants are strongly advised to arrive before 9:00 a.m. in order to complete entry procedures in good time and proceed to the meeting. Taxis are not allowed to enter the grounds of the Palais des Nations. Furthermore, luggage may not be brought into the buildings unless the Security Service grants special clearance.
