## Workshop on National Science, Technology and Innovation Strategy and Policy for Sustainable Development

#### I. Background

Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) is a key driver of economic and social development. Effective STI policies greatly facilitate social and economic development by creating an environment conducive to innovation and economic growth. In recent years, China has accumulated valuable experiences in this area.
