### PROJECT SUMMARY

The Ready4Trade Central Asia project aims to support the development of intra-regional and international trade in five Central Asian countries. This will be done by enhancing the transparency of cross-border requirements, removing regulatory and procedural barriers, strengthening business capability to comply with trade formalities and standards, as well as by improving cross-border e-commerce. The project is implemented by the International Trade Centre (ITC) in close collaboration with national partners. The project is financed by the European Union.

As part of this project, UNCTAD has been supporting the Government of Kazakhstan in analysing its laws in line with the key areas of the Joint Statement Initiative on E-Commerce. The objective of the project is to provide capacity building on those key areas to better equip the Government to make the reforms it considers necessary.

#### **PROGRAMME**

This workshop is part of UNCTAD's assistance and will provide an in-depth overview of the technical components of the report on 'Recommendations for Reform' which was prepared by UNCTAD in July 2022. The recommendations for reform examine the need for, and direction of, legislative reform to facilitate e-commerce and align national law with the current JSI consolidated negotiating text on e-commerce ('JSI Negotiating Text').

The workshop will offer an opportunity to discuss and clarify technical components of the recommendations and their relationship with the sections of the JSI negotiating text. Ultimately, it is expected that the participants can provide feedback on the recommendations to plan the next steps of the projects including further capacity building workshops and the revision of legislation pertinent to e-commerce.

The participants will comprise of government officials from the Republic of Kazakhstan, Members of the Working Group created to develop recommendations on legislation on electronic commerce and paperless trade, the JSC Center for Trade Policy Development (QazTrade), representatives from the private sector will also be in attendance. The event will include presentations given by legal experts and practitioners of digital trade as well as the participation of representatives from UNCITRAL and the WTO.
