# Session 2: Negotiating and implementing product specific rules of origin (PSROs) – Opportunities from convergence

This session introduces advanced analytical tools to evaluate PSROs, drawing on ADB–UNCTAD comparative studies across RCEP, ATIGA, and other ASEAN+1 FTAs. It highlights convergence opportunities and challenges in aligning PSROs to promote trade facilitation and utilization. Building on the global context, this session will also discuss how well-negotiated, business-friendly PSRO and OCP provisions can enhance certainty, utilization, and competitiveness for Cambodia.

### **Session 4: Drafting and updating PSRO**

Effective PSROs must accurately reflect real production processes and adapt to changes in input sourcing, processing, and tariff classification. This session provides practical techniques for drafting CTC-based and RVC-based rules, followed by hands-on exercises on how to update PSROs when the Harmonized System (HS) is revised. Participants will work through examples of HS 2017/2022 reclassification, identify where existing rules no longer fit the new structure, and apply these skills to puzzle-based problem-solving on HS–PSRO alignment.

# Session 5: Utilization Rates and Operational Certification Procedures (OCP) – Understanding Effectiveness and Best Practices

The discussion highlights how certification and documentation affect exporters and explores practical ways to strengthen Cambodia's OCP framework.
