Information note for participants

1. Introduction and draft provisional agenda

The twenty-second session of the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Competition Law and Policy will take place from 3 (afternoon) to 5 July 2024 in Room XIX, at the third floor of the E-Building, Palais des Nations, Geneva, Switzerland. Kindly note that the letter of credentials of representatives should be uploaded to the system during the online registration process.

Other delegates (i.e., representatives of specialized agencies, non-governmental organizations and intergovernmental bodies as well as experts wishing to attend as observers) are also eligible to participate in the session as observers and should register online by the same date using the link above.

Due to the need to comply with registration approval requirements, registration will be closed on 28 June 2024 at close of business of Geneva.

3. Participation

The session will be held in Room XIX, at the third floor of the E-Building, Palais des Nations, Geneva, Switzerland.

Delegates are invited to liaise with their Permanent Missions in Geneva for updated advice and logistical arrangements.

Please note that, contrary to previous sessions and in line with standing regulations for United Nations intergovernmental meetings, only in-person participation will be available.

Before entering the Palais des Nations, delegates are requested to collect their badges from the United Nations Security Service, at the Pregny Gate, Avenue de la Paix 14a, 1202 Geneva.

As part of the new system at the United Nations Office at Geneva, participants will receive a digital badge consisting of their photo, a quick response (QR) code and the name and date of the meeting. The digital badge will be sent to each participant by email once they have been accredited by the meeting organizer and should be downloaded to a mobile telephone or other mobile device. Participants may also print the digital badge in order to use the QR code.

The United Nations Security Service is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Because of the security measures in force, participants are strongly advised to arrive before 8:30 a.m. to complete entry procedures in good time and proceed to the meeting in the E-Building of the Palais des Nations. Participants are requested to carry a passport or similar national identity card with them.

Taxis are not allowed to enter the grounds of the Palais des Nations. Visitors should therefore be dropped off at the indicated entrance gates. Furthermore, luggage may not be brought into the buildings unless the United Nations Security Service gives special clearance.

4. Visas

Switzerland joined the Schengen visa scheme on 12 December 2008. All foreign nationals who require a visa for entry into the Schengen visa area, need a visa to enter Switzerland.

Delegates are advised to seek information on requirements applicable in their case from Swiss diplomatic or consular missions in their home countries. In countries where no Swiss representation exists, missions from European Union member States should be contacted. Where a visa is required, applicants are advised to apply at least six weeks prior to departure to Geneva.

5. Accommodation

Delegates are advised to book hotel accommodation well in advance of the meeting. Hotels in Geneva during the week of the meetings are in very high demand and may be fully booked, given the large number of conferences and other events.

For delegates from Least Developed Countries (LDCs), the organization Geneva Welcome Center (CAGI) offers logistical support for the planning of accommodation and may grant financial aid to reduce the cost. 6. Duration and interpretation

The session will take place on Wednesday 3 from 3 p.m., and Thursday 4 and Friday 5 July 2024 between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. and between 3 and 6 p.m. Interpretation to the six United Nations languages (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish) will be provided.

7. Statements and interventions

Delegations that would like to make an intervention during any of the sessions are strongly encouraged to inform the UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD) secretariat not later than 20 June 2024 at jacqueline.bouvier@unctad.org. Delegations are invited to make one statement per country or organization per session, and to participate in the discussions through one delegate who will take the floor. During the sessions, delegates can request the floor by raising their country nametag in the room.

Delegates are asked to observe the time limit of 3-4 minutes for interventions during the sessions.
