2. Objective of the session:

During the 3rd SSC meeting in 2020, UNCTAD and partners identified the importance to prioritize BioTrade & COVID-19 related activities. In response to this, a global <u>on-line survey</u> was conducted between December 2020 to February 2021 with nearly 400 responses. Currently a study is being carried out by UNCTAD based on the outcomes of the survey, in which the initial results will be presented during the session. The session will also look at lessons learned and good practices taking partners' experiences as case studies. Though the pandemic still continues to unravel, the recovery phase is on the horizon; to this end, participants will be discussing the opportunities and challenges that lie ahead, looking at it from different stakeholder viewpoints and experiences. **This session is co-organized and co-chaired with International Trade Centre.**
