E-commerce can be a powerful driver of economic growth, inclusive trade and job-creation across the developing world, yet many developing countries are still to realize its full potential. Current efforts by development partners are numerous and multi-faceted but they are also seldom holistic and rarely fully focused on building e-commerce economies. A more coordinated, systematic and coherent effort is needed to unlock the power of the Internet for economic development. Therefore UNCTAD took the lead in exploring possibilities for launching a new global initiative on *Aid for eTrade* aimed at unlocking the potential of e-commerce in developing countries. An initial Draft *Call for Action* has been prepared by representatives of governments, international organizations and private sector enterprises involved in e-commerce. These open consultations are organized to collect feedback from all stakeholders on the Draft *Call for Action* and identify priorities for the *Aid for eTrade Initiative*. There will be simultaneous interpretation in English, French and Spanish.
