15:00-Item 3 (b): Panel on ICTs for inclusive social and economic development 17:00 Based on the Main Findings and Suggestions from the Summary Report (E/CN.16/2014/CRP.1) of the CSTD Inter-sessional Panel Meeting in December 2013. and the related thematic report of the Secretary General on Information and Communications Technologies for Inclusive Social and Economic Development (E/CN.16/2014/3, this panel will examine how developing countries can benefit from recent developments in ICTs, including datafication, digitization, big data, open data, cloud computing, hand-held and portable devices like smart phones and tablets, specialized applications and local content to accelerate closure of the digital divide. New specialized activities such as crowd sourcing, imagery to the crowd, open street maps and human geography will also be addressed. The panel and interactive discussion will identify these and other key issues for treatment in the post-2015 development agenda, including public policy, for example in the context of increasing participatory democracy, improving sustainability, and stimulating job creation. Progress made in the implementation of and follow-up to WSIS outcomes at the regional and international levels

Substantive session on the WSIS+10 Review, pursuant to ECOSOC Resolution E/2013/9 para 47.

The session will address key activities and progress made in the implementation and follow-up to the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS), as mandated by paragraph 47 of ECOSOC Resolution E/2013/9. The session will address, inter alia, the CSTD report on the WSIS+10 Review slated for completion by the 18th annual session of the CSTD, policy approaches for Internet governance, progress and plans for the Internet Governance Forum, the NetMundial conference outcomes, the current status of the WSIS+10 High-Level Event Open Consultation Process, and related observations from UN Regional Commissions. The session will conclude with a progress report from the CSTD Working Group on Enhanced Cooperation established by the Commission in 2013. It is expected that the discussion will also provide an opportunity to discuss broader issues related to the ten-year review of WSIS (WSIS+10).
