



Intergovernmental Group of Experts on E-commerce and the Digital Economy

Ninth session

The ninth session of the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on E-commerce and the Digital Economy will be held from 11 to 13 May 2026. The session will open at 10 a.m. on Monday, 11 May. The provisional agenda for the session is contained in document TD/B/EDE/9/1.

Background and purpose of the meeting

The substantive agenda items for the session are as follows:

- (a) Strengthening fiscal revenues in developing countries in the context of electronic commerce (e-commerce) and digital trade;
- (b) Working Group on Measuring E-commerce and the Digital Economy.

Written contributions

To facilitate deliberations and the informal exchange of experiences and good practices on the topics to be discussed, member States and observers are encouraged to submit written contributions to the UNCTAD secretariat by **Friday, 24 April 2026**, at ecde@unctad.org.

Written contributions that share experiences, good practices and forward-looking suggestions with regard to the fiscal policy opportunities and challenges of the digital economy, as well as related policies, are welcome, to inform the discussion on the first substantive agenda item, based on the following guiding questions approved by the Trade and Development Board at its seventy-second session:

- (a) What challenges and opportunities in relation to revenue are the digital economy, e-commerce and digital trade presenting for policymakers and tax administrations?
- (b) How can digital solutions be leveraged to improve the collection of fiscal revenue?
- (c) What are good practices for involving e-commerce platforms on the use of indirect taxation of e-commerce?
- (d) How can the international community strengthen the readiness of developing countries to use taxation in the area of e-commerce and digital trade?

Participation

This session is open to all member States of UNCTAD. Other organizations, including specialized agencies, intergovernmental bodies and non-governmental organizations in the

general and special categories, as well as academia and the private sector, may participate as observers.

Online registration at <https://indico.un.org/event/1019320/> is mandatory for all those wishing to attend the meeting and is required in order to be included in the list of participants. Registration requires uploading an official letter of nomination to represent an organization at this meeting. For government representatives, a note verbale or an email from the permanent mission in Geneva will suffice.

Financial assistance

Depending on the availability of funding, financial assistance may be granted to a limited number of officially nominated government experts from developing countries, to cover the cost of travel to Geneva, as well as a daily subsistence allowance. The decision as to which of the nominated experts should receive financing will be based on the direct involvement and expertise of the experts, on the principle of equitable geographical and gender-based representation and on the needs of beneficiaries, in particular the least developed countries.

Requests for such funding should be made by **Friday, 13 March 2026**, by the permanent mission as part of the official nomination of the expert representative(s) to attend the session and should be accompanied by the following information about each nominee: curriculum vitae; postal and email addresses; telephone and fax numbers; and name of contact person at the relevant permanent mission in Geneva. Once the list of experts to receive financial assistance has been finalized, all travel arrangements will be made in accordance with United Nations rules and regulations.

Logistics

The session will be held with physical participation, in room Tempus of the Palais des Nations. Those who cannot attend the meeting in person will be able to listen to the live audio stream in the six official languages of the United Nations. The link to listen live will be sent to registered participants, at the email address used for registration, one day in advance of the start of the session.

Before entering the Palais des Nations, participants are requested to collect their badges at the United Nations Security Service, Pregny Gate entrance, 14 avenue de la Paix. As part of the new system at the United Nations Office at Geneva, participants will receive a digital badge consisting of their photo, a quick response (QR) code and the name and date of the meeting. The digital badge will be sent to each participant by email once they have been accredited by the meeting organizer and should be downloaded to a mobile telephone or other mobile device. Participants may also print the digital badge in order to use the QR code. The Security Service is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Because of the security measures in force, participants are strongly advised to arrive before 9 a.m. in order to complete entry procedures in good time and proceed to the meeting room Tempus. Participants are requested to carry a passport or similar national identity card. Taxis are not allowed to enter the grounds of the Palais des Nations; therefore, visitors will be dropped off at the entrance gates. Furthermore, luggage may not be brought into the buildings unless the Security Service grants special clearance.
