## Presentation of the report “Rapid assessment of value addition and diversification within and beyond the critical energy transition minerals value chain: Zambia”

### Background

The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), through its Extractive Commodities Section within the Division of International Trade and Commodities, has implemented the project *Critical energy transition minerals: Rapid assessment of value addition and diversification capacity in Southern Africa* to support Zambia in identifying actionable pathways for industrialization and economic diversification beyond raw commodity exports. The advanced version of report of this project is now complete. It consolidates findings, sectoral opportunities, and policy recommendations aimed at strengthening resilience, creating jobs, and fostering sustainable growth.

### Objectives and expected outcomes

The event is designed to serve as a platform for presenting the key findings and recommendations of the report to Zambia’s national stakeholders, ensuring that decision-makers and partners fully understand the opportunities for value addition and diversification. Beyond sharing insights, the event will facilitate an open dialogue on next steps for implementation, including a focused discussion with development partners on how to mobilize support and resources. Ultimately, the event aims to reaffirm Zambia’s commitment to structural transformation and inclusive development, positioning the country to capture

greater benefits from its commodity sectors while advancing sustainable economic growth.

The event is expected to achieve three key outcomes. First, it will raise awareness among stakeholders about the report's findings and recommendations, ensuring that decision-makers and partners fully understand the opportunities and policy directions identified. Second, the event aims to strengthen stakeholder commitment to implementing these recommendations by fostering dialogue and building consensus on the way forward. Finally, the discussions will help identify priority actions and establish coordination mechanisms that will guide collaborative efforts toward advancing Zambia's industrialization and economic diversification agenda.
