
Examine spending and implementation





How is Cobradi Research conducted?






Cobradi Research Annual Cycle








Important notes




- Strong follow up strategy
- Different approaches to different public
- Research team available to doubts and concerns (email, phone, meetings)
- Different tools and instruments to guide institutions
- Research has an informational and educational role,
 promoting awareness and knowledge sharing culture



Lessons learned

- Subnational levels may need more assistance
- List of institution must be updated for every research cycle
- Heterogeneity of institutions' maturity on the subject
- Political cycles (elections) impact the research
- Technology may be tricky. The simpler the better
