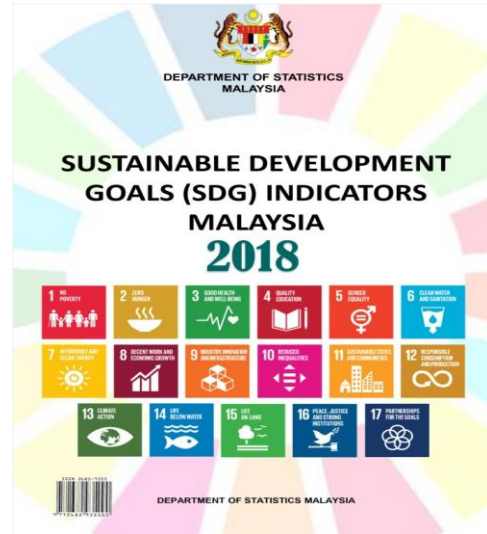


SDG Indicators Report for Malaysia is released annually since 2019...

- Published: 28 Dec. 2018



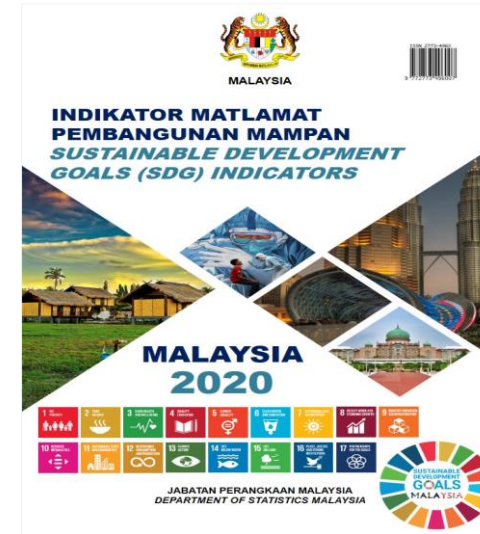
Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Indicators Malaysia 2018

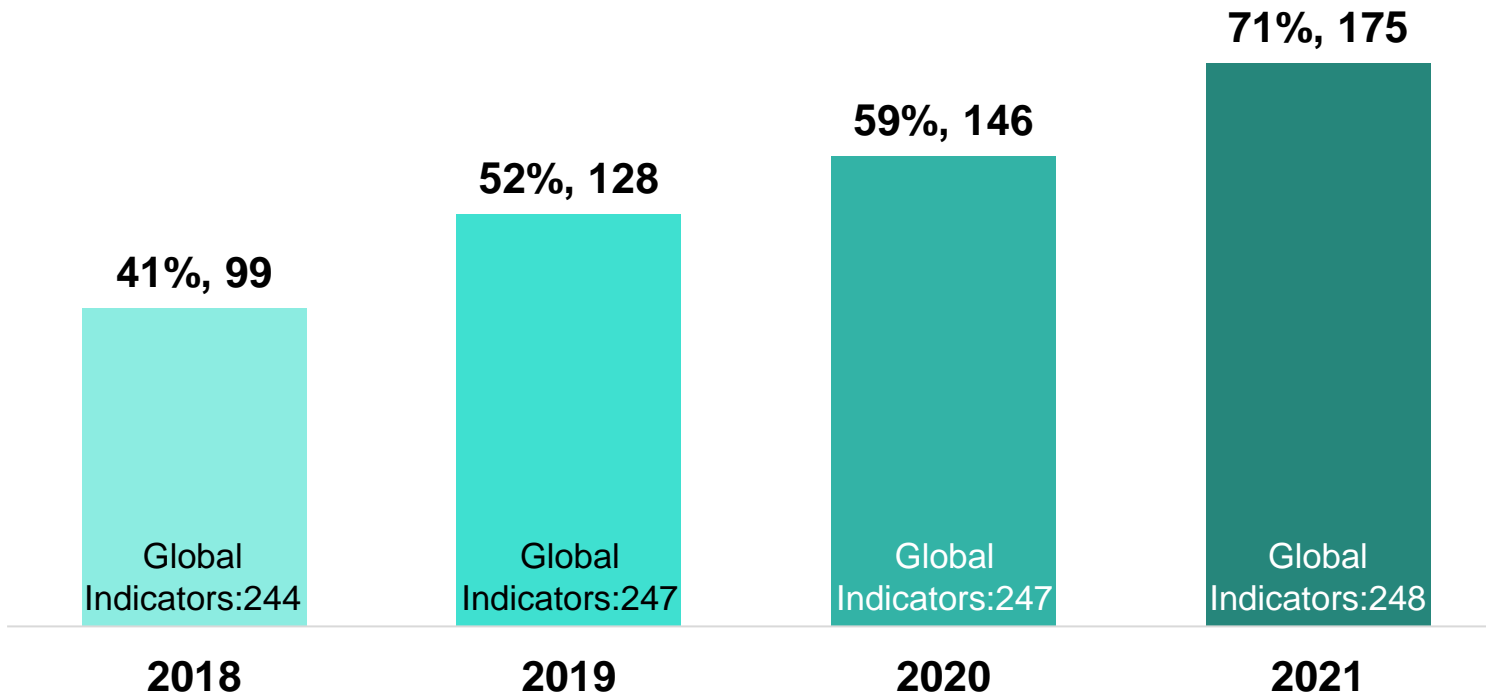

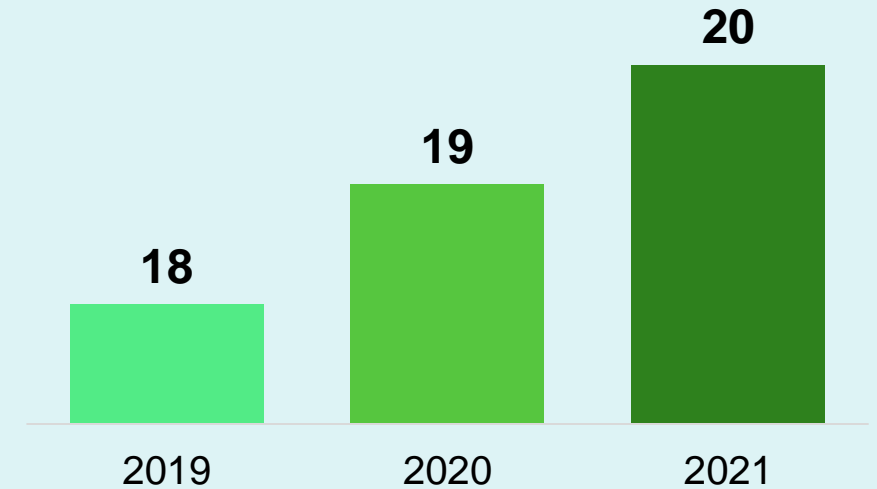
Status of availability at national and sub-national level

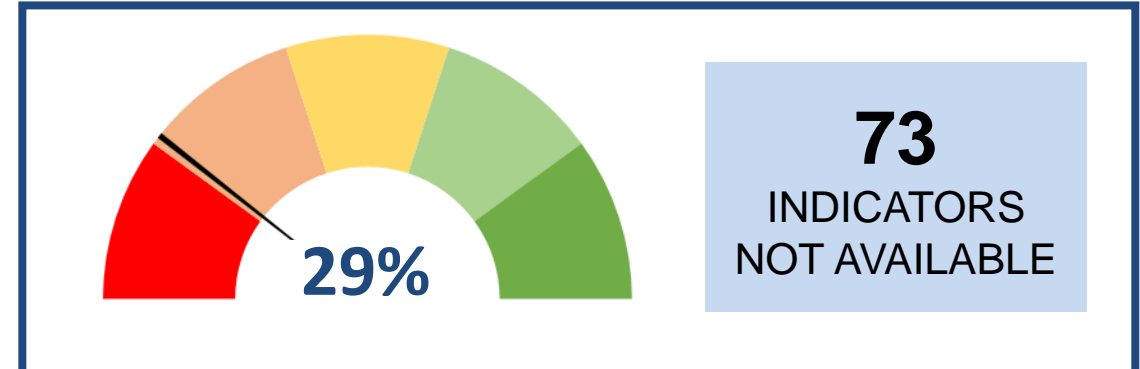
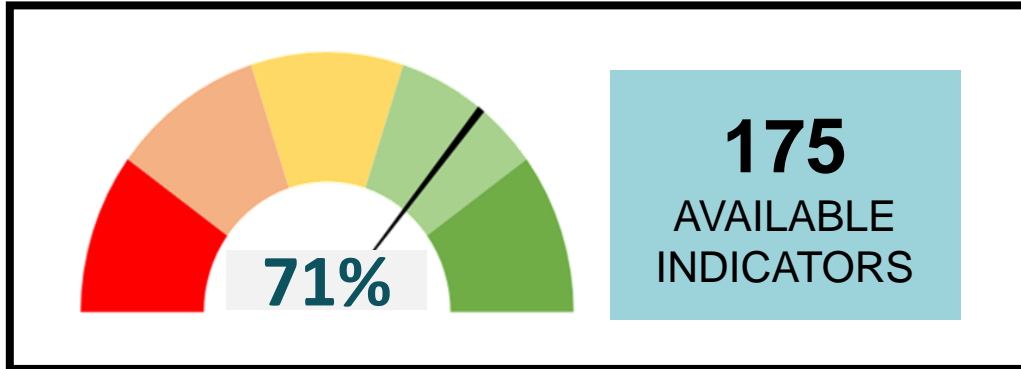

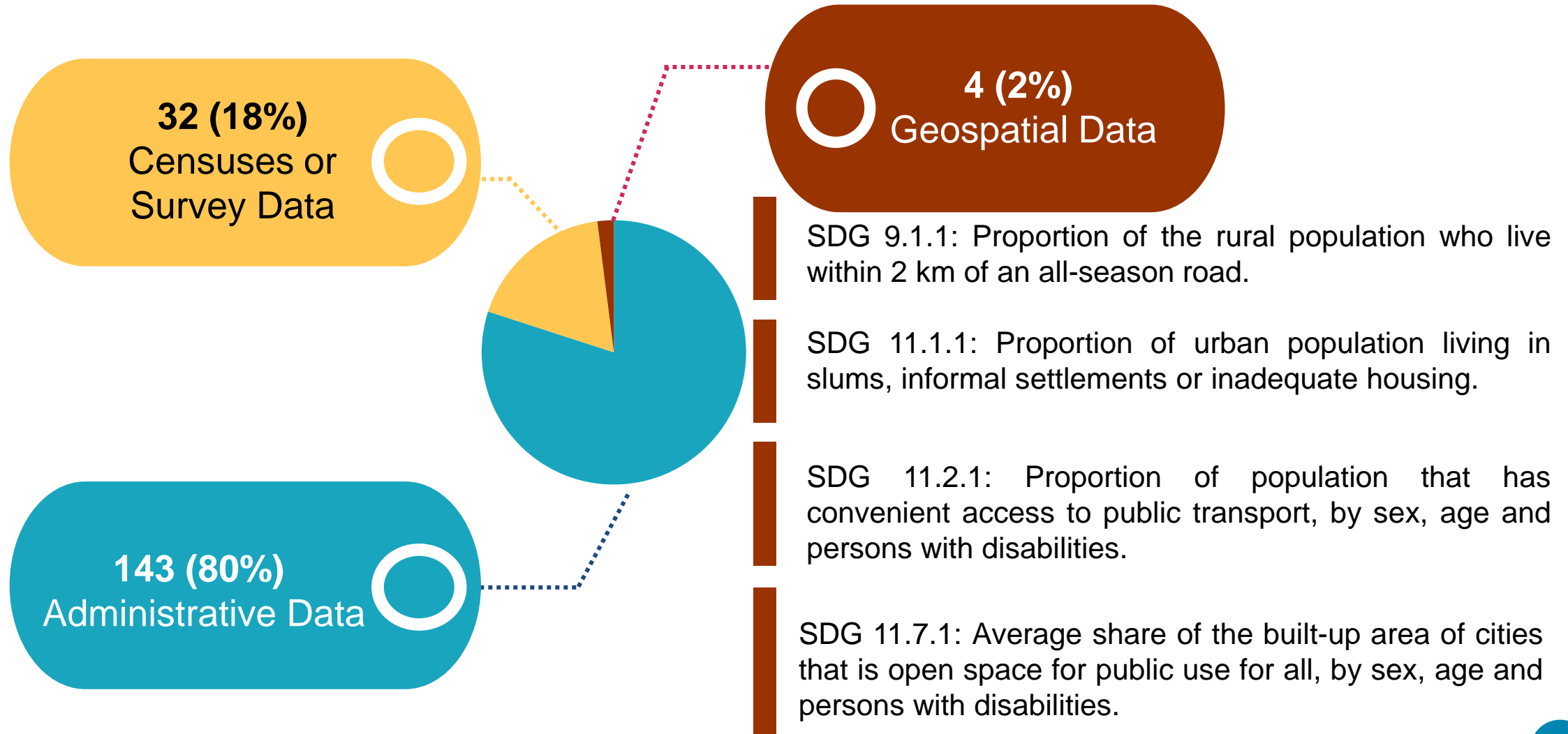

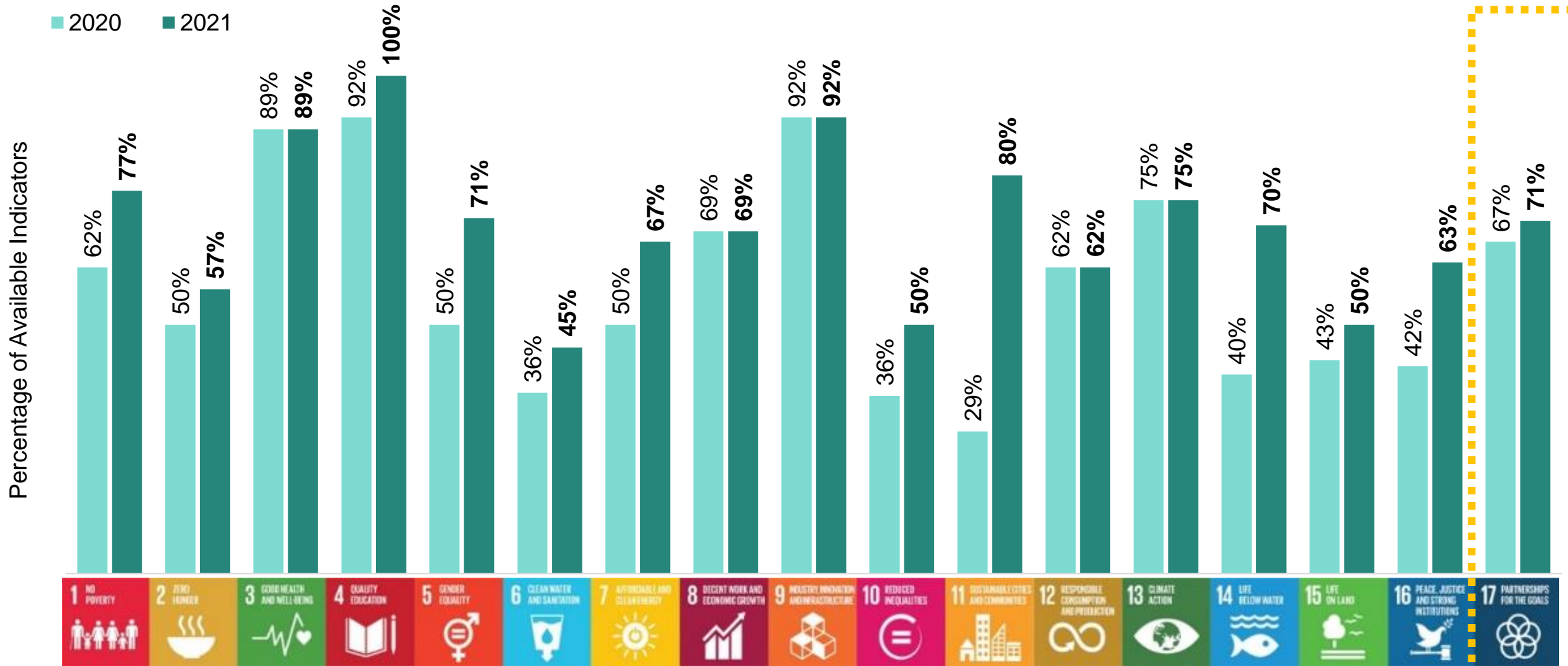




Status of SDG Indicators by Goal in Malaysia

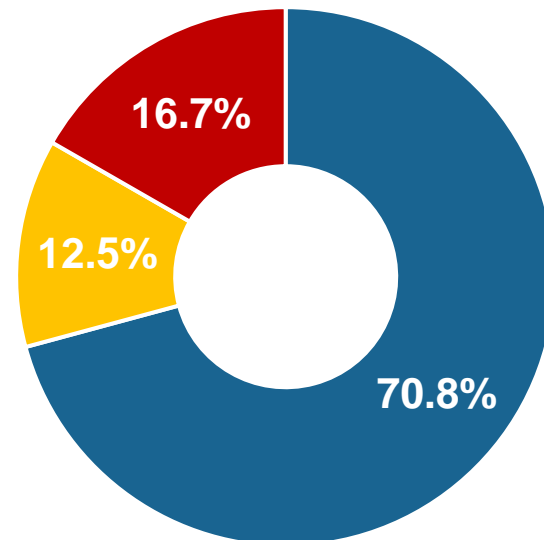


Status of Goal 17 Indicators in Malaysia

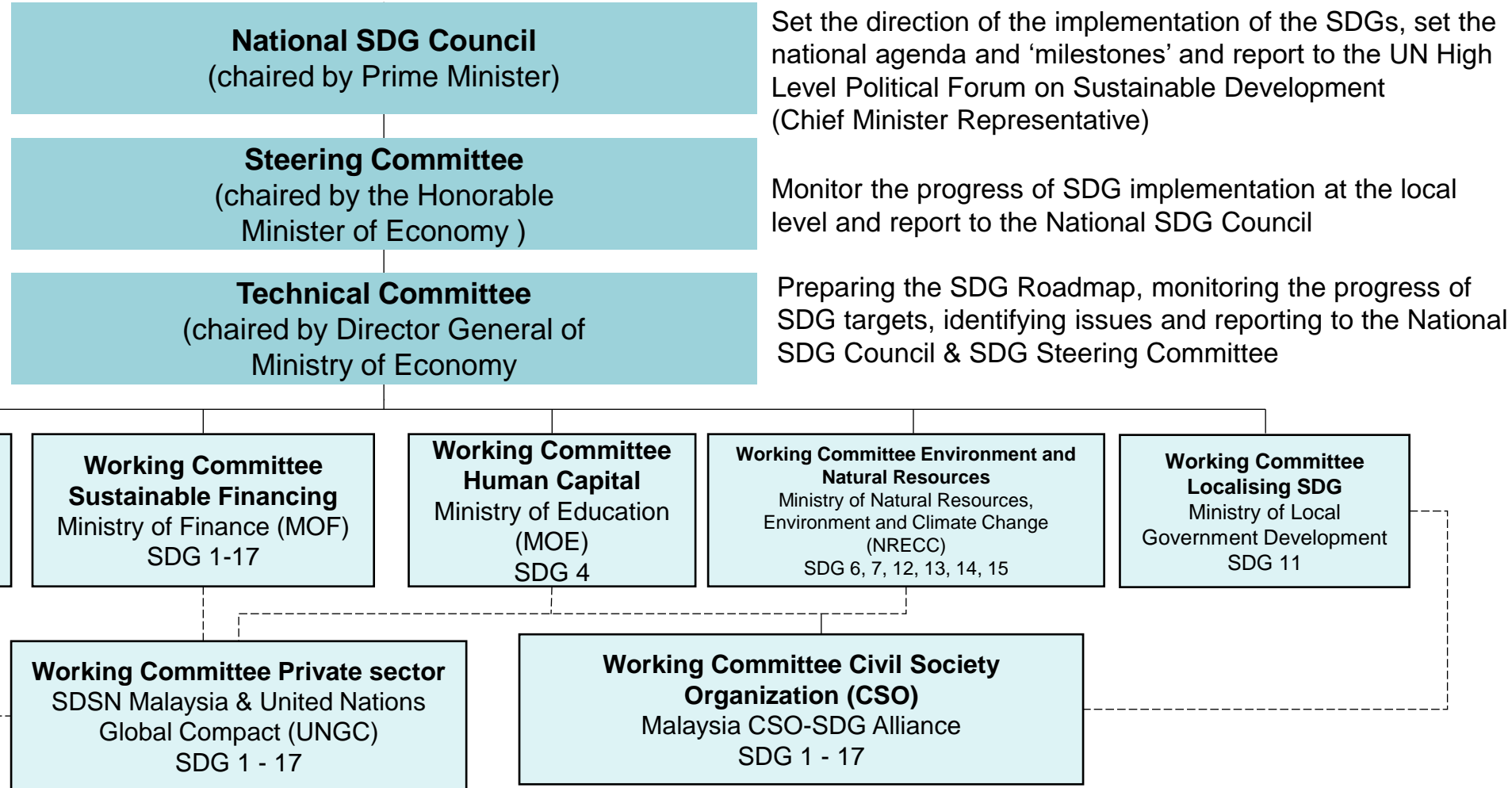


Malaysia's SDG Governance

DOSM act as a Focal Point in the development of indicators and members for each Committee

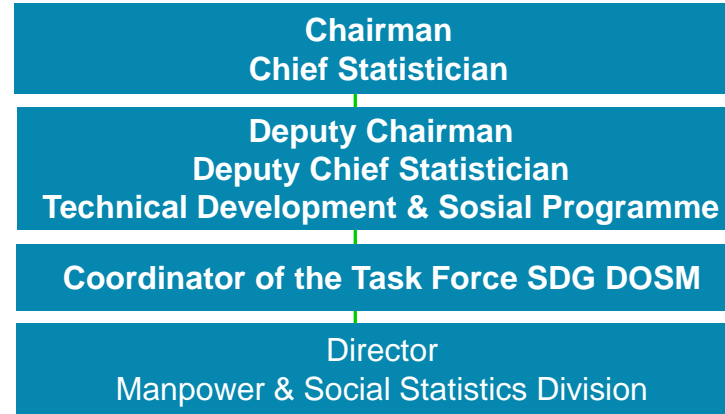


Each Working Committee is represented by members from government ministries/ departments, state governments, UN agencies, the private sector, CSOs/ NGOs and academics



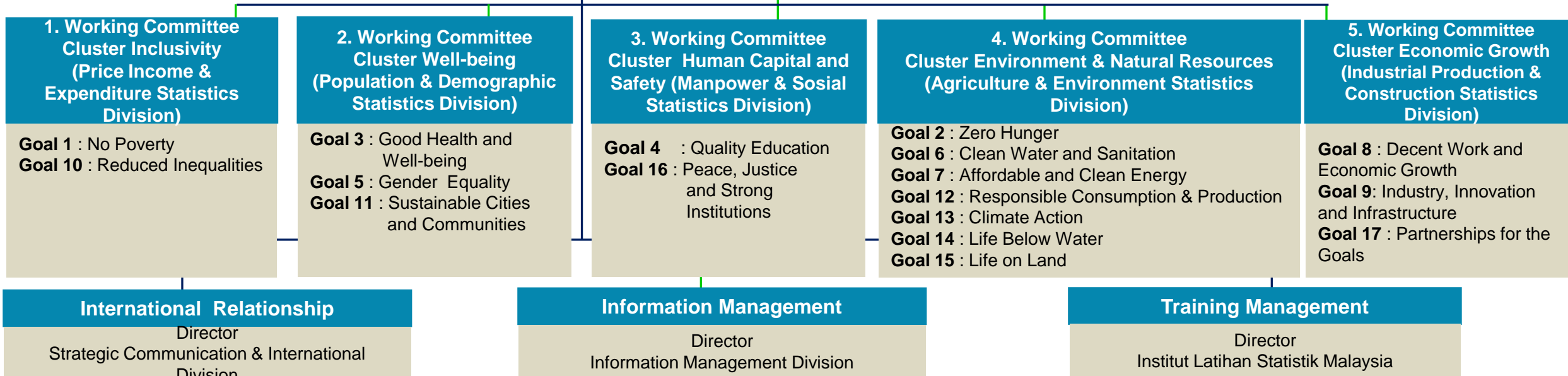
DOSM SDG Task Force...

4. Challenges in Developing SDG Indicators and Strategies





Administrative Data

- 80% of admin data from various agencies/ministries.
- Format data/unstructured data is challenging and takes time to process
- Inconsistent of time series data

Indicators Development

- Metadata is not clearly defined
- Granular data is not available in current surveys

SDG Literacy

- Awareness of the importance of the SDGs statistics



Data quality

- Continues meeting/ discussion/ briefing/ seminar
- Discuss the SDG metadata and harmonise data from agencies and ministries
- Partnership with international agency for some indicator development

Awareness

- Promote the concept and importance of SDGs to agencies and communities
- Localizing SDG

Granular Data

- Data centralized, administrative data
- Revise/update current survey questionnaire
- Planning new survey
