






















#### **Malaysia's SDG Institutional Arrangement**









- 80% of admin data from various agencies/ ministries.
- Format
   data/unstructured data
   is challenging and
   takes time to process
- Inconsistent of time series data

# Indicators Development

- Metadata is not clearly defined
- Granular data is not available in current surveys

 Awareness of the importance of the SDGs statistics
