The legal framework...

- ► Law No. 29158, Organic Law of the Executive Power
- International Technical Cooperation Law (Legislative Decree No. 719)
- Law No. 28875, creates the Decentralized National System of International Technical Cooperation
- Supreme Decree No. 008-2023-RE, establishes National Policy for International Technical Cooperation by 2030 (PNCTI)

... PNCTI is mainly oriented towards compliance with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

SSC in Peru: a receiver/provider country




- Modalities: Bilateral / Triangular / Regional

Key partners (2022): Chile, Colombia and Ecuador. Border development





SDG alignment of SSC initiatives









Metadata availability: SDG 17.3.1

- ► Name: FDI as share of total National Budget
- **Definition:** Shows the share of FDI carried out by non-residents in the economic territory with regard the total national budget.
- Unit of measure: Percentage (%)
- Source: Ministry of Economy and Finance (MEF) Central Reserve Bank of Peru (BCRP)
- Formula $\%IED \ t = \frac{IED \ t}{PNT \ t} * 100$

Where: IED t: FDI value in year of reference PNTt National budget value in year of reference


- Periodicity: Annual
- Coverage: National
- Note: FDI data is extracted from Balance of Payments (BoP) made by BCRP and the National Budget of MEF. FDI data is adjusted by BCRP due to recommendations of MBP6 manual.

Metadata availability: SDG 17.3.2

- Name: Remittances in USD as a proportion of GDP
- **Definition:** Shows the share of transfers made (remittances) by non-residents to be received by residents into the economic territory; with regard GDP
- Unit of measure: Percentage (%)
- Source: Central Reserve Bank of Peru (BCRP) National Institute of Statistics and Informatics (INEI)
- Formula $%RE\ t = \frac{RE\ t}{PBI\ t}*100$ Where: REt: Remittances (in USD) received by residents PBIt: GDP in USD of reference year (average bank exchange rate is used)
- Periodicity: Annual
- Coverage: National
- Note: Remittances value is obtained from Balance of Payments (BoP) made by BCRP and GDP is produced directly by INEI.





■ National Registry of Interventions (RNI): This source identifies programs, projects and activities conducted with Technical Cooperation resources in different modalities.

- ► Annual Declaration Modules: public executors and NGOs submit information every year (during the 1st quarter) about the use of International Technical Cooperation resources of the previous year.
- Integrated Project Matrix: official cooperating sources voluntarily submit the interventions they fund, specifying programmed and disbursed amounts from Official Development Assistance (ODA).

Institutional challenges...

- A better coordinating role of INEI, as head of the NSS
- Multisectoral difficulties: delay in data release of other agencies, bureaucracy
- Needs of more disaggregated data for measuring SSC activities, at unit level
- Going deeper in administrative data
- Private sector collaboration

Opportunities...

- Most effective INEI coordination: overcome legal challenges
- Convene specialized working groups (in progress)
- Disseminating the new conceptual measurement framework with the other agencies
- Having support from UN agencies
