1. Description

Services-led diversification is critical to structural transformation and economic resilience in the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) region. Services trade has been growing in the region, and many countries rely strongly on service exports. The session will provide a forum to identify opportunities and challenges in harnessing the potential of trade in services, particularly the more knowledge-intensive services, to transform other sectors, including other services sectors. It will consider how to strengthen the evidence base and effectiveness of policy action to support the economic resilience of CARICOM countries. The session will provide an opportunity for countries to share practices and identify areas for greater efforts jointly with trading partner countries and the international community.

The session is organized jointly by the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) and the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC).
