The NTFC was officially established on October 20, 2021, through Supreme Decree N° 4600.










STRUCTURE OF THE NTFC OF THE PLURINATIONAL STATE OF BOLIVIA

- 1. Launch the Inclusive Foreign Trade Program. Meeting with private sector to learn about their needs and priorities (June 2024).
- 2. Monitor compliance of WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement through the Reform Tracker digital tool. Private sector representatives have access to the Reform Tracker and have received personalized training on the use of the tool.
- 3. Establish a donor roundtable to comply with WTO TFA commitments.
- 4. Activate the National Trade Facilitation Committee in the Andean Community to assist in related activities.









- 1. Create an official e-mail address for the National Trade Facilitation Committee (NTFC) and the NTFC Technical Secretariat, to improve communication means with all sectors.
- 2. Prepare lists of private entities for dissemination to the Technical Working Commissions.
- 3. Develop capacity building schedule including the private sector: UNCTAD Empowerment Programme for NTFCs.



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
