POTENTIAL OF APPLICATIONS TO DIGITALIZE PRE; AT AND POST-IMPORT/EXPORT ACTIVITIES ENSURING DATA HARMONIZATION AND INTEROPERABILITY BETWEEN DIFFERENT AGENCY SYSTEMS

- Effective when operations are based on WCO/WTO recommendations;
- Efficient after BPR (use of required documents only, avoid duplication of processes, control on restricted information, use/reuse of documents and contents, avoid manipulation of supporting documents, improved controls);
- Use of WCO data model 3N, for Customsrelated activities (Manifest, Declaration, Transit);
- Use of electronic services to standardize mechanisms of data interchange between different systems (e-payments, permits, exemptions, etc.);
- Digitalization allow transaction/operation controls to follow up activities (for all stakeholders) and create reliable statistics

Different solutions require different approaches and particular solutions may be eventually expensive, therefore requiring large investments. A combination of efficiency, trade facilitation and security may fall into these very expensive solutions (for example the Shanghai Container Terminal Company Limited in Shanghai, China, or the Port Klang Container terminal deal in Malaysia);

ESW do not really require large investments;

 Solutions using ASYCUDA involve initial investment from the Government (coordination, development, training, ICT infrastructure) and from stakeholders (ICT)

 ESW needs to go along with ICT and Trade developments in terms of technology and facilitation.
 ESW needs to be self-sustainable

The cost of sustainability (eventually associated to charges to the Trade Community) is minimal compared to the benefits obtained (clearance times, transparency)
