EABC EXPERIENCE OF PARTNERING WITH PUBLIC SECTOR IN IMPLEMENTING TRADE FACILITATION REFORMS

- Jointly with EAC developed NTBs Monitoring Mechanism which was adopted by the Council of Ministers in August 2006.
- Participated in setting up and launching of Regional NTBs Monitoring Committee in December 2008
- Jointly with EAC Secretariat conducting EAC Secretary General CEO Forums and Trade Facilitation Agencies Forums
- Revising EAC Rules of Origin
- EABC Participating as member to the Regional Committee on Trade Facilitation
- Partnering with Public Sector bring sense of ownership, enhance compliance from private and predictability for the reforms





HOW EABC ENSURES A UNIFIED REGIONAL BUSINESS VOICE

- Through observer status in EAC, EABC harmonise private sector positions and present to EAC Policy Makers (Involve all relevant stakeholders)
- Through National Focal Points (NFPs) country positions are collected and harmonized by EABC at Regional Level (Sectoral business representatives must be engaged thoroughly)
- Through regional validated evidenced based policy advocacy which finally presented to EAC by EABC as position of Private Sector (Positions should be informed by evidenced based research for business to have a unified voice)
- Convene Regional Forum representing key stakeholders to validate and Harmonised regional position (Regional forum should be adequately constitute all relevant stakeholders)





HOW CAN REGIONAL BUSINESS FORUMS HELP RECS TO COORDINATE TRADE FACILITATION REFORMS

- Regional Business Forums will input on Regional Trade Facilitation
 Committee which coordinate TF reforms
- Through Regional Business Forums countries can share challenges and opportunities of implementing TF Measures and adopted common standards which will be used by RECs
- Convene Regional Business Forum representing key stakeholders
 from national level to validate and harmonized regional positions





CONCLUSION

- Active Involvement of Private Sector in the Trade Facilitation Reforms is key in improving business environment and boosting intra-Africa trade as well as connecting African SMEs in the global value chain
- Participation of the Private Sector in all stages of Trade Facilitation reforms will enhance private sector compliance on any new TF measures
- Benefits of Trade Facilitation Reforms outweigh their Costs hence need for participation of private sector is of paramount important in cutting transaction costs NAL TRADE
