Trade Facilitation Portal

to describe the practical steps required to import or export a consignment at national or regional level

Awareness and business guides

to make businesses aware of new rules and their benefits, creating greater certainty for traders and fewer opportunities for corruption

Enquiry points

to answer queries on trade- related information and documents through the creation and strengthening of trade facilitation enquiry points

ITC in action

Challenge

Traders perceive the lack of transparency on trade procedures as a major problem to efficiently engaging in cross-border trade.

In some countries, exporters need to go through more than 38 steps, submit more than 56 documents, and visit more than 13 agencies in order to export their goods. This process can take 9 to 25 days.

ITC response

ITC, in collaboration with UNCTAD, supported the establishment of Trade Facilitation portals in Uganda, Kenya, Tanzania, Rwanda, and Tajikistan. They provide step-by step guidance to traders on how to import and export successfully, as well as a platform for informed public-private discussions that address obstacles to trade.

ITC prioritizes the implementation of those measure that countries have frequently allocated to Category C

Findings from our TFA implementation experiences: Selected measures frequently requires technical assistance % of developing countries and LDCs that have allocated



Establishment of trade facilitation portal scalable to online enquiry points

• Compliant with Art.1.1, 1.2 and 1.3 of the TFA

Review, simplify and standardize trade formalities and documentation requirements

Compliant with Art.10.1 of the TFA

Expedite clearance through risk management, pre-arrival processing and authorized operator schemes

Compliant with Art.7.1, 7.4 and 7.7 of the TFA

Establishment of national trade facilitation committee to promote border agency cooperation

Compliant with Art.8 and Art 23.2 of the TFA
