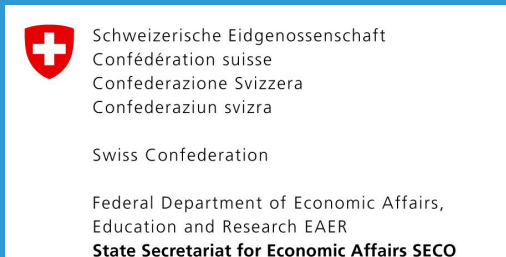

Involvement in the GBF

(GBF priority topic since 2 SSC, May 2019)

UNCTAD to consult, steer, engage and coordinate contributions & inputs of BioTrade partners and other organizations to the post 2020 GBF process.

- Focused on sustainable use & ABS, sustainable trade and BioTrade



Bridgetown Covenant: outcome document of UNCTAD 15
(Membership: 195 countries)

Positive narrative for the GBF

- Sustainable and legal trade provide **incentives** for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity and ABS, **engages private sector** actors, **leverages additional resources** and supports **mainstreaming; trade policies**
- Trade considerations (positive & negative) need to be part of the GBF & the GBF needs to support the shift to sustainable, biodiversity-friendly trade



Activities implemented: status and results

Internal coordination

- **4 SSC meeting/post 2020 GBF session:** Updates, sharing of activities & future collaboration on GBF activities
- **Bilateral meetings / internal notes for partners:** e.g. Note “Status of the process of negotiation of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework”, July 2021

Contributions

- **Interventions/statements and submissions of GBF workshop reports:** e.g. SBI-3/Mainstreaming, OEWS3 & resumed sessions in Gva
- **For inclusion of indicators proposed by BioTrade partners (Aug 2020)**
 - Reply to surveys: e.g. headline indicators (May 2021)
 - Several **exchanges with CBD, BIP (UNEP WCMC)**
- **UN-wide activities**
 - Issue Management Group (IMG) on Biodiversity of the UN EMG
 - UN common approach to biodiversity; Biodiversity Common Approach: 50+ ways to integrate biodiversity and nature-based solutions



- Trends in the legal trade of medicinal plants – Complementary indicator ([Goal B, indicator b22](#))
- Others under discussion

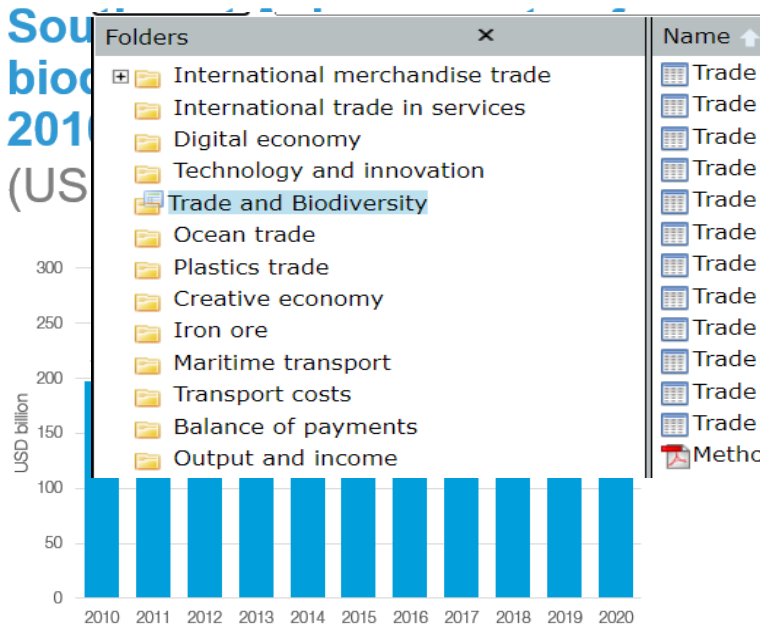

- BioTrade self-assessment tool & Trade and biodiversity statistical tool

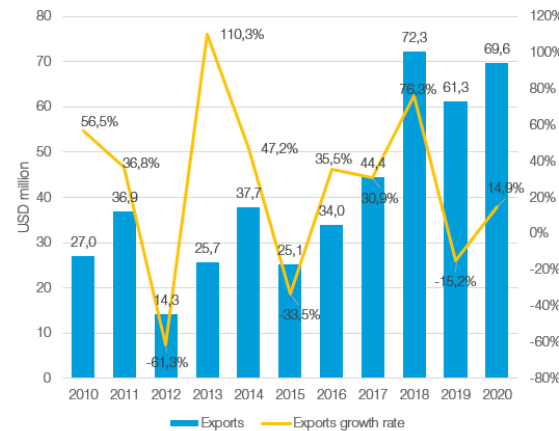


Trade and Biodiversity statistical tool (TraBio)

- Based on the Harmonized System nomenclature, develops a product classification and provides trade flows of +1800 biodiversity-based products and several indicators (from 2010)
- Provide information to CBD Parties and other stakeholders, e.g. GBF reporting & indicators

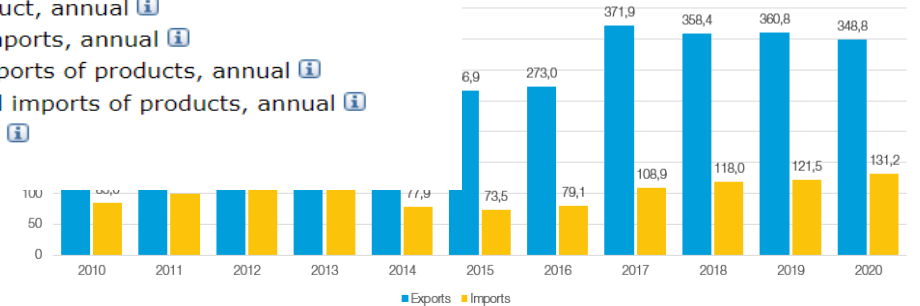


Madagascar essential oils export trends & growth rate, 2010 - 2020 (USD \$1 million)

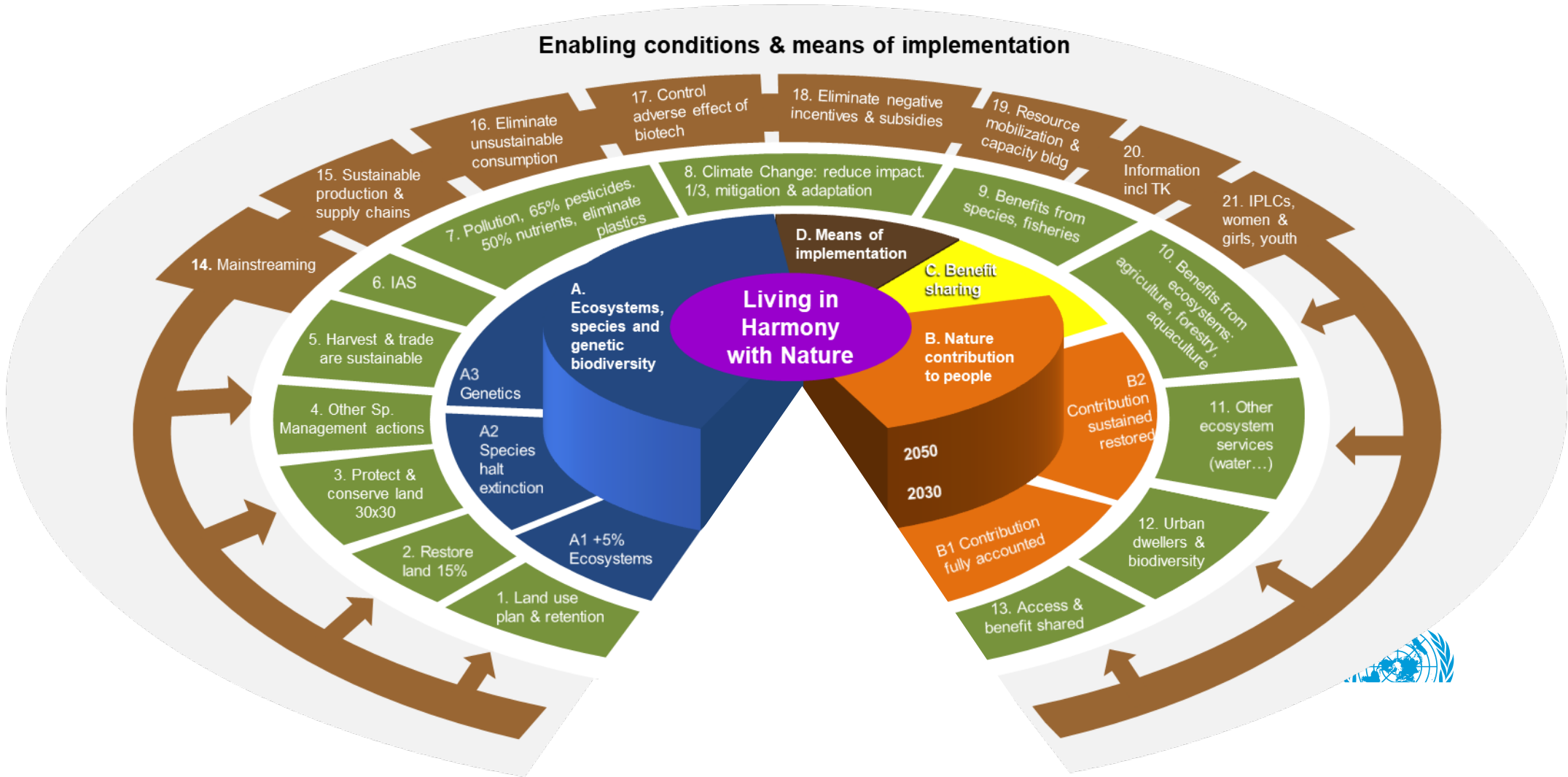

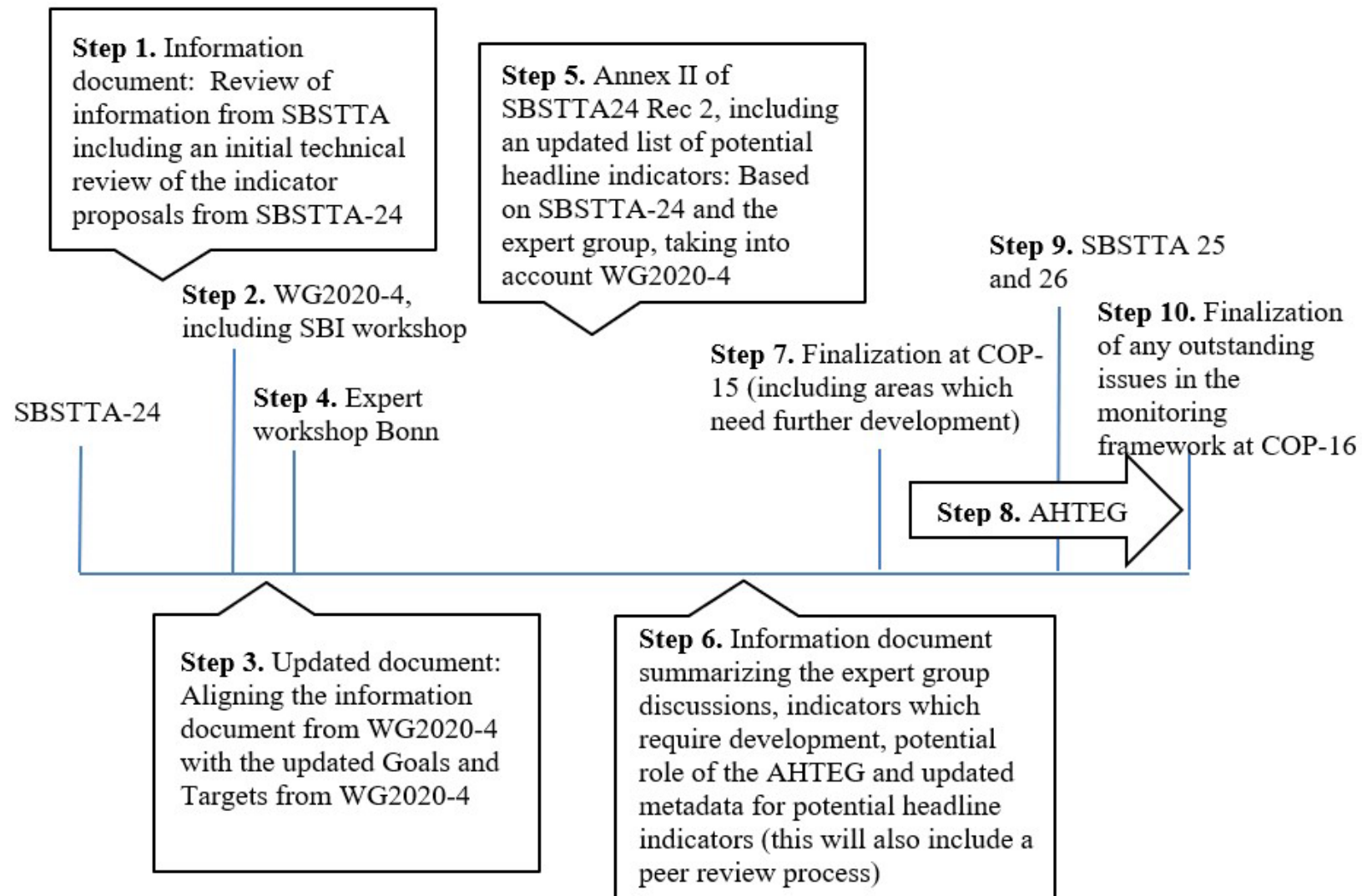
