





The dominant culture of science rarely accounts for different ways of knowing, and often fails to engage the public.





Squared Number of Records















- Citizen Science continues its spectacular growth;
- A legal framework is emerging to support Citizen Science with supporting legislation (the Crowd Sourcing and Citizen Science Act 2015) in place in the US
- Government agencies in the US, EU and Australia are putting Citizen Science strategies in place; and that such strategies "herald a new era of public participation in science by developing collaborative projects that support decision-making and are engaging the public."
