Action 2: Data Collection

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Background

- Noticeable gap in the availability of various kinds of <u>data</u>
 - Trade level : Import and export volume and value; Types of FTAs; Regulatory information (NTMs), etc.
 - Production level : Production volume and value; Number of farmers, etc.
 - Farmer level : Income level; Cost, etc.
- Available but difficult to use
 - Decentralized sources
 - Multiple sources

Problems

- A significant barrier to make an informed and evidence-based decision on green and sustainable trade by government officials and traders.
 - Any less regulated sectors?
 - Bottleneck?
 - Market trends? Consumer preferences?
 - Economic benefit of VSS?
- Monitoring
- People outside the countries



Objective, Actions

- Systematically collect trade policies related data (NTM and VSS) and address the gaps in data availability.
- 1. Review or strengthen a data collection system.
 - Identify crucial metrics and data sources
- 2. Exchange information on data collection methods at the MSG level.
 - Data collection methods, data itself
- 3. Improve national data collection with new technologies WISELY
 - One additional column in the customs system
 - Geographic information system for auditing
