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Germany's Sustainable Development Strategy

- Revised 2016 to integrate Agenda 2030
- Implementation on three levels
 - 1) Implementation and impact in Germany
 - 2) Impact on other countries and global public goods
 - 3) Supporting other countries
- Comprehensive system of reporting and sustainability impact assesement
- Voluntary reports to the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development

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Trade Facilitation (TF)

- Policy consultations
 - Supporting Trade Facilitation Needs Assessments
 - Advising National Committees and Ministries
 - Supporting regional integration initiatives
- Customs procedures
 - Harmonizing customs procedures and regulations/laws
 - Offering technical support to optimize procedural practices and implement infrastructure reform projects
- Regulation of quality and security standards
 - Harmonizing national product standards with international norms (WTO TBT, ISO etc.)
 - Supporting the mutual recognition of product standards in regional agreements

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German TF Portfolio

- Current Project Volume
 - > €40m for projects fully dedicated to TF
 - > €180m for trade projects partially covering TF (10-30%)
- Global Initiatives
 - German Alliance for Trade Facilitation
 - Trade for Development Fund
- Countries/Regions
 - TF-specific projects: Côte d'Ivoire, Senegal, E.A.C., ECOWAS, Central Asia, Southern Eastern Europe
 - TF-related projects: SADC, Nepal, EAC, China, SAARC, Jemen, Kirgisitan, Myanmar, Mosambik, Bangladesh, Nigeria, Afghanistan, SG-SICA, Kosovo, Caucasus, Serbia

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Example: TF in Montenegro

Customs Procedures Reform Project



Project: Cooperation between Germany, DHL Express and the Montenegrin Customs Administration

Aim: Expeditious release of express consignments through the implementation of pre-arrival processing

- 65% of express consignment are released within 1 hour upon their arrival

Approach:

1. establishing the legal and regulatory framework
2. optimizing procedural practices and technical capacities
3. offering training and study trips to customs officials
4. knowledge-transfer to the region


Result: pre-arrival processing has been implemented.

- The number of express consignments released within 1 hour upon their arrival has increased **from 25% to currently 53%** (Sept. 2017)

- Main targets: reducing GHG-emissions & health risks
- Report to the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development
 - Transport Infrastructure Plan 2030
 - Research for Sustainable Development framework
 - Climate Action Programme 2020
 - Engagement at Habitat III-conference

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Sustainable mobility – Development cooperation

- Focus on integration, knowledge-sharing and leveraging
- Member of several multi-stakeholder initiatives and partnerships
 - German Partnership for Sustainable Mobility (GPSM)
 - Sustainable Urban Transport Project (SUTP)
 - Sustainable Mobility for All (SuM4All)
 - Transformative Urban Mobility Initiative (TUMI)

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Sustainable mobility – Development cooperation

- Technical cooperation
 - **Asia:** Timur-Leste, Indonesia, India, ASEAN
 - **Sub-Sahara Africa:** Namibia, DR Congo, Somalia
 - **Latin America:** Peru, Brazil
- Financial cooperation
 - **National level (e.g. policy-based lending)**
 - Tunisia, Indonesia, India
 - **Intermediary level (e.g. development banks)**
 - Planned projects with CAF in Peru, Brazil, Ecuador

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Case study

Zero-Emission-Corridor

- Part of the C40 Cities Finance Facility
 - Support to reduce GHG-emissions
 - Strengthen capacities
 - Catalyse further action
- Funding partners: BMZ, USAID
- Implementing partner: IADB
- Example Mexico-City
 - 100 busses and bicycle-lane on 22 kilometers
 - Annually reduction of 80.000 t GHG-emissions
 - Fostering economic development

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Case study

TUMI

- Central implementation initiative of the BMZ
- Supporting sustainable traffic systems
- Approach:
 - a) Investing in Know-How and infrastructure
 - b) Leveraging investments through partnerships
- Implementation
 - 1) Financing sustainable traffic infrastructure
 - 2) Training of 1000+ employers and managers
 - 3) Innovation competition (COP23)
