LEVERAGING ONTIPs

- Trade facilitation is key for successful cross border Trade ensuring swift movement of goods
- Implementation of trade facilitation reforms in EAC (WTO TFA) was timely based on what Covid 19 Pandemic brought forth
- ✓ TIPs ensured that there is transparency and accessibility on cross border formalities at all times; especially Micro, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises; deeper understanding on the process



InfoTradeKe PORTAL (Background)

- Kenya Trade Network Agency (KENTRADE), in partnership with TradeMark East Africa, UNCTAD and International Trade Centre (ITC) has been implementing the Information for Trade in Kenya Portal (infoTradeke) since 2016
- The portal was launched in November 2017 making Kenya, the Ist country in Sub-Saharan Africa to implement the portal. To date the portal has published import, export and transit procedures for over ninety (90) commodities


- Having been launced in 2017, During the pandemic the portal has become the authoritative source of accurate and clear information on Kenya's international trade procedures over the years
- ✓ We witnessed increased traffic on the portal registering 18,000 visits monthly up from 10,000 the previous years

 Thus the portal had been significance in process re-engineering and automation of business processes through Simplification

 In collaboration with the NTFC, simplification has enabled automation of all possible processes as much as their infrastructure allows to speed up processing and reduce the need for physical contact between border agencies and traders.



b) What can we do with it? (Simplification of trade procedures)





Simplifcation Benefits

- Reduction in cost and time:-The simplification process has reduced the administrative burden cost incurred by businesses e.g...in the registration procedure from KES 40,197.35(USD 402) to KES 15,287.29 (USD153) therefore saving business a total of KES 24,910.06(USD 250) approximately 62% of the total cost
- ✓ Adoption of Multiple channels of payment e.g. mobile money platforms, e-payments, Mobile Banking etc
- Time taken from one institution from another(e-Paperless at play)
- ✓ Promotion of Public-Private Dialogue
- ✓ Increased compliance



InfoTradeKe & COVID 19

A new menu on Covid-19 measures is mapped on the portal in line with measures institutions are putting in place to promote e-paperless environment.

- ✓ Increased adoption of mobile money payment platforms by regulators especially at the onset of the pandemic
- ✓ Automation has been on the fore front for a number of institutions
- ✓ Increased digital awareness campaigns for the portal to increase its traffic especially during the current prevailing situation.



Implementation & Monitoring

KenTrade in collaboration with NTFC regularly follow-up with the respective Government Agencies and key stakeholders on simplification implementation of the proposed measures.
