The East African Community (EAC) is a regional intergovernmental organization of the Republic of **Burundi**, Republic of **Kenya**, Republic of **Rwanda**, Republic of **South Sudan**, the United Republic of **Tanzania**, and the Republic of **Uganda**, with its headquarters in Arusha, Tanzania.

To widen and deepen economic, political, social and cultural integration in rder to improve the quality f life of the people of East Africa through increased competitiveness, value added production and investment.

EAC REGIONAL INTEGRATION PILLARS

A HIGHLIGHT

CUSTOMS UNION

2005

Enabling the EAC Partner States to enjoy economies of scale, with a view to supporting the process of economic development through the establishment of a Single Customs Territory.

COMMON MARKET

2010

Accelerating economic growth and development while maintaining a liberal stance towards the **5** Freedoms of movement for all factors of production in the region.

MONETARY UNION

2013

Laying the groundwork within a 10-year span, while allowing the EAC Partner States to progressively converge their currencies into a single currency in the Community.

POLITICAL FEDERATION

ONGOING

Putting in place initiatives to fast-track political integration. In May 2017 EAC Heads of State adopted the **Political Confederation** as a transitional model of the East African Political Federation.

 Real-time monitoring along Northern Corridor
Single platform used by Partner States (Kenya, Rwanda & Uganda)

Challenges faced:

- Delays
- High cost of doing business
- Non-tariff barriers
- Difficulty in transit monitoring.
- High cost of monitoring
- Poor coordination with Partner States in the EAC
- Diversion of transit cargo



Current RECTS Landscape Across EAC

Currently, the EAC RECTS is operational in four countries; namely: DRC, Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda.


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
- The RECTS is fully integrated with the National Customs Management Systems (Asycuda, ICMS)
- 4 Regional Centralized Monitoring Centres for KRA, URA, RRA & DGDA supported by > 20 fully equipped Rapid Response Units are fully in 24x7 operation
- During the year 2017 nearly \$7.1million worth recovery in 288 incidents of cargo in transit noncompliance in the Northern Corridor.
- □ The United Republic of Tanzania also operates a National ECTS (TECTS) on the Central



Corridor also fully integrated with the National Customs Management Systems (TANCIS)






E-monitoring of cargo along the Corridors - NC







- Improved turnaround time for transporters (4trips increased to 8trips per month due to reduced transit time).
- Improved Transit accountability (easy Cargo movement trail, autobond cancellation, enhanced driver behaviour monitoring etc.)

The Future

- Improve percentage of e-monitored cargo by acquisition of additional e-seals
- Installation of <u>Smart gates</u> for enhanced border controls and security
- Fuel sensors for effective monitoring of imported fuel, and full
- * <u>Systems integration</u> across the region between revenue authorities for timely information exchange.
