### a whole plant approach



Our aim is to normalise hemp use as a **commodity** in the **food**, **feed**, **cosmetics**, and **manufacturing** industry, by setting a **clear science-based legislation**, incentivising **investments**, and encouraging the development of a **sustainable value chain**.

Synthetic fibres replaced natural fibres, and Cannabis plant was demonised by public policies, resulting in a huge decrease of hemp production in Europe



# bioeconomy



Bioeconomy products are the most promising applications with the biggest output markets in perspective...

- Global Natural fibre market in 2019:

Hemp as **construction material** is the most versatile material, with a *carbon storage* over a long period (50+years), one of the most advanced hemp applications with the *greatest benefits* (reduced energy costs, better air quality, mold resistance, ...).















### How to develop hemp bioeconomy?

### Positive policy framework

Set up more Increase stalk hemp processing production lines **Build consumers** markets



## QS U (A)













- Increasing consumer interest for alternative plant derived food > expanding markets.
- One of the best seeds in terms of fatty acid balance and protein content (protein strategy).
- Finally a common maximum THC limit (traces) for seed derived food established for the whole EU > facilitating investments.



# feed









- Perfect for **organic feed** and highly sustainable (use of byproducts).
- Maximum levels for THC should be soon established (although too low).
- Many ongoing (and promising) research projects on the cannabinoid effect on animals (US and Europe).
- In the EU hemp extracts are considered as feed additives (: marketing authorisation required), while most of other hemp products are feed materials.

## The flowers and leaves of an agricultural crop (Cannabis sativa L.) are used for the production of extracts/CBD









! Diluted in a vegetable carrier (usually hempseed oil)





CBD, most naturally aboundand cannabinoid in the hemp plant (isolate, full spectrum extracts or synthetic) is considered (today) in the European Union as **Novel Food** 

: Products undergo an **authorisation** process, aimed at assessing their safety of use, before they are marketed.

In order to share the costs (3,5M euros) of the **tox** and **clinical** studies, EIHA created a consortium and is undergoing the process on behalf of its members. The results will bring a clear **Accaptable Daily Intake**, as for any other food supplement.

In the framework of the Novel Food Application the EIHA is performing...

### Tox study on CBD isolate and full spectrum on rats (with Eurofins) 1,9M€

- Objective: derive the ADI, the NOAEL and the LOAEL for CBD.
- Status: CBD isolate completed / full spectrum ongoing (ready Q1.2023)

### THC clinical trial on 400 humans (with Opis) 1,6M€

- Objective: establish the ARFD of 7µg/kg BW (today EFSA opinion 2015 says 1 µg/kg BW), derive a proper NOAEL and LOAEL for THC
- Status: started in June 2023 (Q1.2024)





### The results for the *isolate* show the following ...

Effects have been registered on four organs.

These effects are NOT adverse!

- The NOAEL is lower than initially expected and than existing literature.
- The inferred ADI is of 17.5 mg/day of CBD expressed in CBD equivalent (it was proposed to EFSA + FSA)

### Regulatory hurdles...

The farming and processing of the whole plant, including the flowers, need to be clearly authorised.



Hemp flowers are clearly excluded from the 1961 UN Single Convention, as they have no inotoxicating effect.

Flowers are already legal in...





- Optimism about the future of the sector (carbon storage, biobased products, plant based food).
- Need for support of public policies and science.
- Encourage investments and long term vision.
- Help structuring the value chain, encourage cooperation and training.
- Allow whole plant approach for more economic and environmental sustainability.
- Recognise the exclusion of hemp from SC61
