Project Cluster B: "Seamless" (ESCAP's activities)

- Research and analysis of challenges arising from the COVID-19 crisis in respect of contracts for international carriage of goods, focusing particularly on land and multimodal transport and summarize findings in a technical paper (in progress)
- Identification of critical issues (including applicability of forcemajeure clauses and other) with a view to develop recommendations that could be used by governments in developing related national, bilateral or multilateral policies, as well as by the transport industry in their operations
- Facilitation of delivery of expert legal analysis, advice and technical guidance to policymakers at national, regional and international levels, as well as SME traders, shippers, and consignees, particularly in developing countries to assist them in addressing some of the key commercial law implications of the COVID-19

Purpose:

- increase awareness of Government officials and transport operators in Asia and the Pacific region on the ways of addressing some of the key legal implications of COVID-19 for commercial contracts covering transport of goods
- assist shippers and consignees, particularly in developing countries in
- provide a summary of research and preliminary analysis of the challenges arising from the COVID-19 crisis
- identify critical issues (including applicability of force-majeure clauses)
- suggest several practical recommendations on contractual policy that could be used by transport industry stakeholders in their operations to better cope with the emerged challenges



Content:

- Government reaction: COVID-19 specific legislation case studies (China, India, Singapore, UK)
- The Force majeure concept (in international legal instruments, trade rules, civil and common law)
- Force majeure contractual clauses
- Legal and tax implications for invoking force majeure
- Contractual remedies in the absence of force majeure contractual clause and other legal doctrines that excuse non-performance (frustration, hardship etc.)

Practical recommendations for the industry

The following three scenarios were proposed for consideration:

- entering into a new agreement and needs to provide a force *majeure* clause adequate for the current conditions of the ongoing pandemic;
- invoking force majeure contractual protection under the earlier agreement;
- invoking protection other than the *force majeure* clause to absolve it from the contractual delay or performance failure.
