






Safe trade: a balancing act

Closures: 38 and 17 countries announced land and sea border closures, respectively on the outset of covid-19

Target: under strict regulations, closures targeted reducing movement of people, while exempting essential supplies

Regulations: mandatory testing, sanitizing trucks, limiting crew members, and designated transit resting areas etc.

Africa's exports, monthly (year-on-year % changes, 2020 vs 2019)



Cross-border trade disruptions


Trucks at the Malaba border in Uganda, 27 May 2020

Best practice COVID-19 border responses across RECs



Health Screening

- Mandatory health screening of drivers and crew
- Coordinate health screens when there is a functioning OSBP
- Ensure all border points have requisite personnel



Testing and Certification

- Deploy mobile labs and test kits to border posts
- Immediately isolate positive cases at borders
- Develop regional test certificate and expedite clearance



Hygiene and PPE

- Provide hygiene facilities and supply PPE at all border posts
- Make mask-wearing and sanitary products mandatory
- Provide disinfecting facilities



Crew Size

Introduce regulation to limit size of crew

Best practice COVID-19 border responses across RECs



Border Management

- Apply risk management on essential supplies only if high-risk
- Pre-clear goods and coordinate inspections / single window processing
- Designate priority lanes and safe parking facilities



Information Sharing

- Publish border measures taken to fight COVID-19
- Distribute information at customs offices and border crossings
- Publish route maps and facilities' locations for truck drivers



Digital Solutions

- Use electronic cargo tracking systems to facilitate contact tracing
- Automate trade facilitation processes
- Encourage e-payment platforms



Operational Mechanisms

- Carry out capacity building of border staff
- Establish a body to coordinate implementation of border regulations
- Assist Member States to implement COVID-19 guidelines
- Publish revised guidelines as may be required

Longstanding trade facilitation challenges



African Costs of Transportation are 63% higher than developed countries



Freight Costs as % of Import Value are **11.4% for Africa** vs. 6.8% for developed countries



Customs Transactions include

20-30 different parties, 40 documents, 200 data elements



Customs Processing Delays can cost **\$185 per consignment for each day** of delay

COVID-19: opportunity to overcome trade facilitation challenges

The crisis had **magnified**Africa's cross-border
inefficiencies

Increased **urgency** to do better and find innovative solutions to facilitate safe and efficient cross-border trade


AUDA-NEPAD Traffic Light System

Ranks performance of border posts and identifies bottlenecks and corrective actions

Successfully piloted: EAC, ECOWAS, SADC

Update to make COVID-19 relevant

- Update existing indicators: reflect specific COVID-19 specific border challenges
- 2. Include new health & safety indicators
- 3. Regularly publish assessments



Policy recommendations for action

Increased use of ICT Capabilities

Development of Pharmaceutica Industries in Africa

Development of Multi-modal and Inter-modal transportation systems

- Development of Road-side truck stopsCus along transit corridors
- **Development of Transport Corridor Observatories**
- Diversification of sources of sustainable enery

Key Results so far

COMMON AU COVID-19 **GUIDELINES**

The African Union Commission (AUC) with technical assistance from UN ECA, developed Continental **Guidelines on Trade and Transport Facilitation for the** management of persons, goods and services across Africa during the Covid-19 pandemic.

- **RECs and Border authorities established committees** to coordinate guidelines implementation and resolved border issues
- This was important given shared trade and transport facilitation goals of the AfCFTA
- Was built drawing upon existing REC guidelines and "best practices"
- A common AU COVID-19 Test Certificate for transport workers was required to facilitate a harmonized approach to certifying test results

MAINTAIN AFCFTA MOMENTUM

- Speeding up AfCFTA operationalization to hasten economic recovery
- African counties can start to **implement "ready-to-go" elements** of the Agreement including NTB mechanism and Annexes on Trade Facilitation and **Customs Cooperation**

Key Results

USE OF TRADE FACILITATION TOOLS

- **AUDA-NEPAD Traffic Light System was updated** to include COVID-19
- Regularly published information on "relative" ease of movement and clearance at border posts to better inform logistical planning

DEPLOYMENT OF DIGITAL SOLUTIONS

- Electronic Cargo Tracking Systems scaled up and replicated
- Mobile banking and payment systems encouraged to reduce contact
- AfCFTA to be utilized to fast track digitalization of procedures and systems to enhance competitiveness of African exporters

INFORMAL TRADERS PROTECTED

- Governments to take steps to reopen informal cross-border trade across official border crossings with sanitary, testing and quarantine facilities
- Governments to assist small-scale traders and provide relief to informal traders
- Full implementation of Simplified Trade Regimes to help to incorporate informal traders into official trading systems
