- ICANN and the oversight of critical Internet resources – by US
- Criticized by EU, China, etc.
- WSIS process launched by ITU in 1998
- UN WSIS one of the global programs 2001
- Geneva phase 2003
- Enhanced Cooperation in Tunis Agenda 2005 diplomatic ambiguity



Background - Tunis Agenda

- 69. We further recognize the need for EC in the future, to enable governments, on an equal footing, to carry out their roles and responsibilities, in international public policy issues pertaining to the Internet, but not in the day-to-day technical and operational matters, that do not impact on international public policy issues.
- 71. The process towards EC, to be started by the UN SG, involving all relevant organizations by the end of the first quarter of 2006, will involve all stakeholders in their respective roles, will proceed as quickly as possible consistent with legal process, and will be responsive to innovation. Relevant organizations should commence a process towards enhanced cooperation involving all stakeholders, proceeding as quickly as possible and responsive to innovation. The same relevant organizations shall be requested to provide annual performance reports.

Background - Consultations

- 2006 Mr Desai, UN SG Special Adviser <u>Informal consultations</u> – No agreement
- 2008 <u>UNSG invited 10 organizations to report</u> on EC <u>progress</u>
- 2010 UN USG convened a multi-stakeholder consultation (<u>statements</u>, <u>written</u> <u>contributions</u>, <u>UN SG report</u>)
- 2012 UNCSTD Chair conducted a multistakeholder consultation (<u>Summary report</u>)



CSTD WG 1.0 - Mandate

UNGA Resolution 67/195 (2012)

- "invites the Chair of CSTD to establish a working group on enhanced cooperation to examine the mandate of WSIS regarding EC, through seeking, compiling and reviewing inputs from all Member States and all other stakeholders, and to make recommendations on how to fully implement this mandate;"
- report to CSTD in 2014



CSTD WGEC 1.0 meetings

- Physical meetings in Geneva:
- 1st meeting: 30 May (P.M)-31 May 2013
- 2nd meeting: 6-8 November 2013
- 3rd meeting:24-28 February 2014
- 4th meeting: 30 April 2 May 2014



- Long discussion on Agenda
- Decision on procedural issues
- 2 breakout groups led by Brazil and India identified categories - suggested questions
- Plenary finalized questionnaire based on results of breakout groups
- Decided on next steps



- 18 questions including
 1 question about stakeholder
 1 question for comments, additional topics
- Reflects consensus of the Working Group on topics of relevance to Enhanced Cooperation
- Open to all stakeholders
- Extended deadline for responses:
 17 September 2013



- Agree on agenda and procedural questions
- Identify topics/categories
- Discuss responses to the questionnaire
- Create rolling document reflecting discussions
- Start drafting of recommendations
- Create Correspondence Group to map identified public policy issues to existing mechanisms and/or identify gaps

UNGA Resolution A/Res/70/125 (2015)

"We request the Chair of the Commission on Science and Technology for Development, through the Economic and Social Council, to establish a working group to develop recommendations on how to further implement enhanced cooperation as envisioned in the Tunis Agenda, taking into consideration the work that has been done on this matter thus far;"



Mandate of WGEC 2.0 (cont'd)


- "The group, which shall be constituted no later than July 2016, will decide at the outset on its methods of work, including modalities, and will ensure the full involvement of all relevant stakeholders, taking into account all their diverse views and expertise"

Multi-stakeholder Model

CSTD Mandate related to the WSIS

Focal point in the system-wide follow-up to the outcomes of WSIS

advise the Council thereon, including through the elaboration of recommendations to the Council aimed at furthering the implementation of the Summit outcomes.



CSTD Mandate related to science and technology for development

The Commission acts as a forum for:

- the examination of science and technology questions and their implications for development; the advancement of understanding on science and technology policies, particularly in respect of developing countries and;
- the formulation of recommendations and guidelines on science and technology matters within the United Nations system.



Contribute to WSIS process recommending ways and mechanisms of cooperation

Contribute to the implementation of SDGs

Know the importance and the complexity of the issues and our tasks

Seek points of agreement and compromise (in the unlikely case of difference of opinions)

We are motivated, ambitious and realistic




